STRAWBERRY FESTIVAL **AT MILTON, JUNE 6.**

MILTON, Or., May 20.—Milton's annual strawberry day festival will be held Thursday, June 6. Although the Strawberry day, as in past years, has been fathered by the Commercial Club, the event is entirely a citizens' affair, and not confined to the club in any sense.
It was proposed that Strawberry day be held during the week of the May festival at the college, and this would have been agreed upon had it not been for the fact that good strawberries will not be very plentiful that early in the season.

GENERAL NEWS.

The Presbyterian General Assembly, in session at Louisville, Ky., has decided on Atlanta, Ga., for the 1913 meeting. The southern wing of the church will also meet there.
All records are believed to be broken in New York by Dr. Allyn Gorton, who, at the age of 80 years, is the father of twins. The babies are said to be in perfect health and weighed just six and a half pounds each on arrival. Mrs. Gorton is approaching middle age.
After rescuing the lone survivor, August Palmer, of the lost barge Hayden Brown, the United States lighthouse tender Armeria, the large-

est in the service, has been wrecked off the shore of Cape Hinchinbrook, Alaska, and is being pounded to pieces by a tempestuous sea. The Admiral Sampson has answered the distress call of the Government vessel and after battling for several hours with one of the wildest seas this season has succeeded in rescuing the 22 persons on board. They included seven officers and 21 men, besides the Hayden Brown survivor.

NEWPORT, Or., May 20.—Renos Wood, of Chitwood, 20 miles east of here, was almost instantly killed this morning while working in his sawmill. He slipped and fell back over a saw and was practically cut in two. He just managed to gasp out before dying. "Don't tell my wife," his wife being seriously ill. Wood is a descendant of one of the oldest families in this section, is about 40 years old and leaves a widow and two children.

UNIFORM SALARY BILL **GOV. WEST'S LATEST IDEA.**

Pay of County Officials should be Governed by Population and Wealth, He Says.

SALEM, Or., May 20.—A bill to make salaries in every county of the state on a more equal basis than under the present system, and provide for an automatic adjustment every two or four years when a new apportionment is made, is being worked out by Governor West.

The system will be prepared carefully, and will be submitted to members of the Legislature before January so that each one will have an opportunity to study whatever merits or demerits it may have. "Salaries to county officials throughout the state," said the Governor tonight, "are made without relation to each other. One county, for instance, may pay its County Judge \$300, while another county may pay its Judge \$1200, though the counties may not vary say or but little in their respective populations, area or assessed valuation of property. Again, a County Clerk may be getting more salary than a County Judge or another official may be drawing more than a County Clerk. There should be a uniform basis for salaries."

Friends Bring in Bills.
"Whenever the Legislature convenes, friends of some officials in a county, who are elected, come in with bills to boost these officials' salaries. Officials without friends in the Legislature do not get any of the raises. A score of bills to raise salaries were introduced at the last Legislature but I vetoed them all."

"Salaries should be equalized and reduced by some system. What I propose to do is this: I will prepare a statement showing the salaries of each county official in every county in the state. These statements for each county will then be submitted to Granges and other organizations as well as prominent individuals in each county, and they will be asked to return to me an estimate of what they think their county should pay out in salaries. Out of all that are submitted, an average will be struck for each county and a total secured for the state. For example, say that after all these figures have been returned it is found that \$450,000 is required to pay all county officials. This will be submitted to the Tax Commission, and it will be determined what amount of assessment will be necessary to raise that amount. The present total valuation of the state is \$900,000,000, so that 1-20 of 1 per cent will be sufficient to secure the \$450,000 necessary. Share to Be Apportioned."

"Each county will then be apportioned a share of this total according to area, population and assessed valuation. Multnomah, for instance, though small in area, is much larger in population and assessed valuation than any of the other counties, and consequently would be entitled to a larger part for the salaries of its officials."

BOSTON, May 21.—Clarence V. T. Richeson was electrocuted at 12:17 (Eastern time) this morning. The current was turned on at 12:10 and the prisoner was declared dead at 12:17. The former Baptist clergyman, confessed poisoner of Avis Linnell, of Hyannis, his one-time sweetheart, was outwardly calm when he entered the death chamber and he retained his composure while the straps and electrodes were being adjusted as he sat in the electric chair.

Eyes Are Kept Closed.
Richeson walked to the electric chair erect, eyes straight ahead until he sat down. Then he closed his eyes and kept them shut until the end. Seated in the chair, he was asked questions by the Rev. Herbert S. Johnson, his spiritual adviser. In his answers he said: "God will take care of my soul and I pray for all. I forgive everybody."
The last of the questions was: "Are you willing to die for Jesus?"
