MUST PAY ITS TAXES OR REDEEM GRANT CLAIMS.

Injunction Asked Against Douglas and Coos Sheriffs by Southern Oregon Co. Denied.

PORTLAND, Or., May 21.—One of the side issues in the land grant forfeiture suit of the United States against the Southern Oregon Company was decided yesterday by Judge Wolverson in the United States District Court, but the questions involved in the main case were not passed upon. A number of years ago Congress made a land grant in Douglas and Coos Counties as a subsidy for the building of a military road from Coos Bay to Roseburg, and one condition was that this land should be disposed of to actual settlers only in small tracts at \$2.50 an acre. Eventually the Southern Oregon Company obtained these grant lands and recently a suit was filed by the Government for forfeiture of the land because the terms of the grant had not been complied with.

Prior to the suit the Southern Oregon Company had been paying taxes on these lands, but ceased when the forfeiture suit was instituted. Tax collectors, however, continued to assess the property and in default of payment the land was advertised for sale. Then the Southern Oregon Company sought an injunction against this tax sale until the suit was settled. To this the Sheriff's demurred and Judge Wolverson yesterday sustained the demurrer and denied the application for the injunction, for the reason that the defendant claimed title to the land and did not recognize the Government's claim. This decision, it is said, will cloud titles to the land whichever way the main suit may be decided.

If the Government wins, all money paid for taxes or the money paid for tax titles will be lost, and if the Southern Oregon Company wins it will have to redeem the tax titles.

Under Judge Wolverson's decision, the Sheriffs of Douglas and Coos Counties will now proceed to sell the Southern Oregon Company's lands for delinquent taxes unless it redeems the property. During the three years that the suit has been pending the company, uncertain of its title, refused to pay its taxes in either county. It owes Douglas County nearly \$10,000 altogether in taxes, penalty and interest.

Portland Oregonian: Earl C. Bronaugh, who on January 24, 1911, was appointed guardian of Leon L. Vial, because of Vial's spendthrift habits, yesterday filed in the Circuit Court an affidavit in which he states his ward is unable to pay temporary alimony or attorney's fees to his wife, Anna H. Vial, who has started suit for divorce. Judge Bronaugh says Vial's gross annual income out of his quarter interest in the block at the northeast corner of Sixth and Washington streets is \$4000 and that the taxes amount to \$2100. Judge Bronaugh says he has so far drawn no compensation for his own work; that he has been busy paying up the debts contracted by Vial and his wife prior to the guardianship and that he is paying Mrs. Vial \$125 a month at her husband's request. He says that his ward is unemployed and if working could not earn in excess of from \$30 to \$40 a month. The guardian declares he has had a difficult task in straightening out the financial tangles of Vial, and that debts are still unpaid. Vial, he says, purchased the 15 acres in Washington County on contract and his payments are delinquent.
