All they ask is not to be disturbed. This therefore explains their present anxiety for the re-election of Taft. 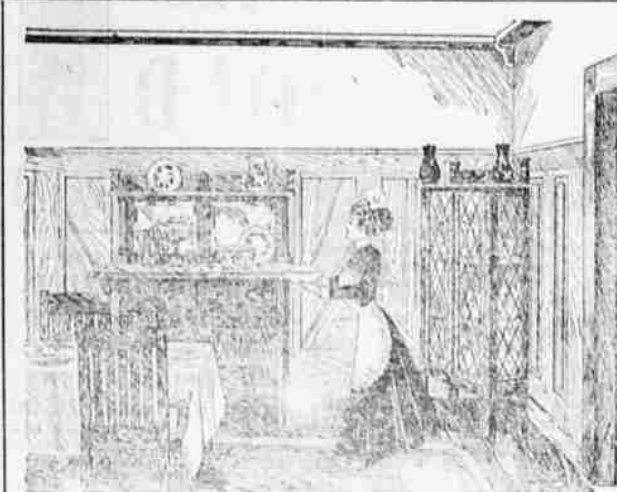

Everybody should be glad that Col. Roosevelt was able to start home today, after the dastardly attempt on his life last Monday evening. While that shot gave him more free advertising than he could have purchased for \$5,000,000, yet there is no question that he would have spurned an offer of twice that sum rather than take the chance of the desperately narrow aberration of the would-be assassin's aim to which he owes his life. While millions hope that he may live for many years, it is not at all probable that he will ever again be elected to the Presidency. His present candidacy only doubly assures the defeat of Taft and that with the divided vote that Wilson will probably carry twice as many states as both Taft and Roosevelt.

Don't fall to vote against the single tax and county division measures. Both are iniquitous. The so-called "majority rule" measure should also be defeated, as it contains a "joker" that would practically kill the operation of the initiative law and would decidedly hamper the working of the referendum. The county divisionists who were so overwhelmingly defeated at the last election, are working a very shrewd scheme this time, which, if carried, will permit any ambitious village to create itself into a county seat, taking in just so much of the surrounding country as it may see fit, and the people of the remainder of the county to be thus carved in pieces will not be allowed any voice whatever in regard to the proposed division. If this measure, by any chance, should happen to carry, Oregon, instead of having 34 counties, would be slashed up into at least four times that number in a very few years, vastly increasing the tax burden.

Durland, of Roseburg, Oregon, were joined in wedlock by Rev. Dr. W. S. Barnes, pastor of the First Presbyterian Church. The couple were unattended. A reception took place at the home immediately following the ceremony. Mr. and Mrs. Durland will leave this afternoon for Roseburg, Oregon, where they will commence housekeeping. Mr. Durland is a prosperous farmer of that place. Mrs. Durland has been residing with her sister for the past year."

CIVIC DUTIES VERSUS THE POLITICAL GAME.

Ida M. Tarbell says one of her chief objections to woman suffrage is that "it takes the attention of women from what I believe to be their real civic duties by interesting them in the political game, when they should be concentrating their attention on specific civic work." The same woman under woman suffrage is only one of many political units, with ignorant and indifferent women voters added to the other elements arrayed against her success. A few women today are idealizing the ballot, while what will really solve juvenile delinquency, intemperance, the white slave traffic, and the social evil is education, education and more education in the homes and from the earliest hour of childhood, and therein lies the civic duty of women, bigger than the casting of any ballot, and absorbing enough to occupy all the women of Oregon for all time.

It is to keep the women of this state out of the "political game" and leave them free for this greatest of all their duties that we ask you to vote against the woman suffrage amendment at the coming election. 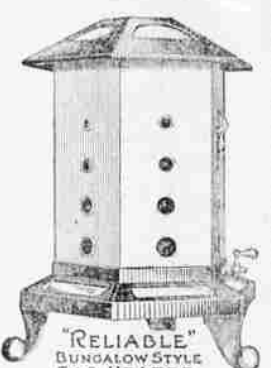
