LOCAL NEWS

Eugene Guard: Chester Humphrey, the young man who was kicked in the face by a horse at his home near Irving Monday afternoon, died at the Eugene hospital Tuesday evening. The blow from the horse's hoof was a terrible one and besides breaking the young man's upper jaw, caused concussion of the brain. He was 23 years old and leaves a mother, four brothers and four sisters.

In the Salem Journal of Thursday appears a letter from Mrs. J. T. Miller, of Hayhurst, near Yoncalla, in behalf of the Humphrys brothers, sentenced to be hanged on March 21. The letter refers mainly to the movements of the Humphrys while residents of the Hayhurst vicinity and says they are apparently wrongfully accused of unlawful acts while living there. Doubtless Mrs. Miller and many others are unaware that since being sentenced the last time for the murder of Mrs. Eliza Griffith, an elderly lady living alone in Benton County, the Humphrys have confessed and told the details of that horrible fiendish crime. According to their story, after entering the home of their defenseless victim each in turn held her while the other unspoolingly assaulted her, the second choking her to death. They then ransacked the house for whatever money they could find and before leaving each again beatfully assaulted the body of their lifeless victim. The case is too revolting for discussion, and punishment in any degree adequate for such fiendish acts is difficult to imagine. With such an example before them it is no wonder the voters of Oregon, by an overwhelming majority, decided to retain capital punishment on the statute books—for life imprisonment would have no terrors for such fiends as the Humphrys.

Lyman received word from Washington the first of the week that the bids for carrying the mails over a proposed rural route west from Sutherlin has been rejected as all were considered too high. This means that fifteen months must elapse before this matter can be taken up again. It is understood that the bids were between \$700 and \$800.

IMPROVEMENT PARAGRAPHS.

COLOR SIGNS TO SHOW THE RIGHT HIGHWAY.

Unique Scheme of Designation of Four Main Arteries Urged by E. Stewart.

"The highway department of the state of New York has officially adopted a scheme suggested by Frank L. Lyon, secretary of the New York State Automobile association, for the designation of the main highway which could be followed by the California highway commission with good results," says E. Stewart, an automobile agent.

"The scheme is to designate the five main highways by color signs. This does not mean the erection of signposts, but the painting of fences and bridge approaches along the various roads; also decorating telephone and telegraph poles with bands in the colors which designate the route that they are on. This is being done by the local automobile clubs situated on these routes.

"As already adopted, California has four main routes—the coast route from San Francisco south, the coast route from San Francisco north, the valley route from San Francisco south and the northern inland route from San Francisco. It would take very little expense to mark those routes, and it would be a wonderful help to the visiting motorists. The work, however, should not be commenced until it was definitely settled on what should be the end of the national highway into San Francisco from the boundary of the state. The colors selected should be such that the state of Nevada and other states to the east might be able to use them for marking their sections of the national highway."

HOW GOOD ROADS WILL HELP THE MERCHANT.

Better Highways Bound to Keep the Neighborhood Trade at Home.

The increased area of distribution of goods, wares and merchandise of our factories and stores demands a new method and means of transportation. Good roads will extend the radius of service of the city merchant and add to a much larger territory. Good roads will keep the many millions of dollars of our citizens at home instead of being spent through outside routes in cities outside of the state. Good roads bring renewed energy and thrift to the merchant in every market center of the state. Farm products will be marketed more easily through the year. Sales of merchandise and sections will be distributed over a larger period of time. Good roads will mean good times to the merchant. Bad roads keep trade away from a town or city. —Better Roads.

OWE MUCH TO SPRAYING.

Reasons Why Lime-Sulphur is the Solution to Use.

The growing of apples is an enormous industry which is constantly expanding. This is due largely to the fact that of all fruit the apple is in most steady demand, and is a very reliable crop. The profits on a well conducted apple ranch or orchard are fairly large, the labor entailed in caring for the trees and marketing the crop is not excessive, and there is scarcely any section of the country in which some varieties of apples will not thrive.

Spraying is the one operation above every other which determines the market value of apples, and yet in many instances it receives the least attention of all orchard work, according to a Farm and Home expert. The matter of spraying is one which must be given careful attention and study by each grower for the reason that the practice giving the best results in one section may be of indifferent value in another.

For instance, the Ben Davis is so seriously ransacked by application of Bordeaux mixture that, as a rule, naturally fine fruit of this variety will be rendered second class if this spray is used.

Lime-sulphur solution is apparently as effective as Bordeaux mixture in the control of apple scab, and will control leaf spot and other minor troubles. In sections where spraying for bitter rot is required the lime-sulphur treatment for scab and leaf spot could be followed by application of Bordeaux mixture for bitter rot and apple blotch, as it has not yet been determined that the lime-sulphur spray will control these diseases. Arsenate of lead is unquestionably the poison to use with the lime-sulphur mixture.
