In Size and Weight.—The biggest bears in the world are to be found on Kodiak Island in the Gulf of Alaska. South of this is a great stretch of territory that stretches out into the Pacific. The Kodiak bears are of the polar breed, perfectly white, with long, heavy fur, and at full growth are twice as large as the black bear of the Rocky mountains. They weigh 2,000 to 3,000 pounds, stand as high as an ordinary cow and are the biggest carnivorous animals living. The tracks they leave in the snow have often measured fifteen inches in length and ten inches in width. They are savage and fight desperately when attacked.
