

METHODISTS FIGHT GREAT UP-HILL BATTLE AND TIE 8-RUN LEAD

Baseball Struggle With Baptists Closes in Ninth With Score 10 to 10—Some of the Features

The third game of the Twilight League was played Tuesday evening between the Baptists and the Methodists. The Baptists went on the field feeling quite sure of victory on account of having the advantage of playing a previous game, while the Methodists had no opportunity to try out their lineup before actually playing the game.

It is rumored that R. W. Strong and other leather-jugged Baptists had been practicing a Baptist yell in the rug room of Strong's furniture store for several days, which they expected to spring on the unsuspecting public immediately at the close of the game, which was hoped out to be a victory for the Baptists.

R. Dunham pitched for the Methodists the first two innings, and the Baptists succeeded in checking up five runs in these two innings against

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the Methodists' one run, made by Jewett in the second. McClintock then went in to pitch, and did not warm up for a couple more innings, the Baptists piling up four more runs in the first two innings pitched by McClintock, giving them a total of nine runs to the one lone run registered for the Methodists.

After the fourth inning McClintock tightened up, and the Baptists were able to secure only one run, this coming in the 7th. The Baptists were gone again in the 5th, 6th, 8th and 9th, while the Methodists failed to score in the 1st, 3rd, 4th, 5th and 6th innings.

With the score 9 to 1 at the end of the 6th inning, victory seemed practically assured for the Baptist team. Goodman retired from the box and Ritzman went in to clinch the victory. In the 7th inning Goodman started the run getting with a clean hit, followed by a hot one by Quine. A sacrifice hit by McClintock advanced both runners one base, and

a wallop by Riebel scored both runners. Riebel scored a moment later on a passed ball by the catcher.

The Baptists added one to their score in the 7th on a wild pitch, after which hit out and stole second and third.

In the 8th inning, the Methodists, rejuvenated by their success in the 7th, succeeded in piling up four scores. McClintock's hit was responsible for two of them, he scoring on a passed ball a little later.

The Baptists went to bat the first half of the 9th two scores to his good. McClintock's pitching was such that the first two batters hit into the pitcher's hands and were promptly thrown out at first, while the third batter fanned.

The last half of the 9th Wiley came to the bat for the Methodists, and made a clean hit. Dunham followed with a hit, but was forced on second by Whipple's grounder to short. A hit by Quine put Wiley on third, Whipple on second, and before the third could be retired, both men scored.

After the onslaught of Ritzman in the eighth inning he was replaced by Goodman, who endeavored to stop the batting streak of the Methodists, but was unsuccessful.

The game was called on account of darkness at the close of the ninth inning, with the score tied.

Four of the Baptist team died on bases and seven Methodists.
