GARDNER NEWS

(From Port Umpqua Courier.)
The mill closed down again the last of the week owing to the want of room for lumber on the dock. The San Gabriel finished loading Monday and sailed for San Pedro with the cargo. The furmasted schooner Caroline is at the dock, also the Louise, which began loading this week.

S. Smautaus, J. O. West and Kenneth McAlpinie, contractors from Portland, have been in the Umpqua country during the past week looking over the proposition of making a bid for the construction of the left at the mouth of the Umpqua. Claude D. Harper, of Sutherlin, is registered at the Gardiner hotel this week.

Southern Pacific officials and those connected with the building of the Willamette Pacific, with their families, will hold a picnic and barbecue at Winchester Bay on July 14. A special train with all necessary facilities will be run from Eugene. The picnic will be a private affair and will be attended by railroad people and invited friends.

It is reported that the Gardiner Mill Company will receive a half million feet of logs from the Tide Water Company as a trial lot, and if they prove to be in good condition they will probably take over the log which the Tide Water Mill Company has in its boom on the Stuslaw, amounting to about 10,000,000 feet. The logs have been in the water for about two years.

A fishing party consisting of J. P. Hoey, W. R. Fountain, of Eugene; Dr. Dix, H. J. McQueen, L. S. Simpson, of Coos Bay, and W. P. Reed, of this place, left for the falls above Sulphur Springs Sunday to spend several days among the fish tribe of the upper South River. We expect to hear of narrow escapes, exciting adventures, and above all the "biggest fish ever."

J. J. McMillan, the well known insurance agent from Bandon, has returned to Gardiner and to spend the month of July. Although somewhat dissipated himself, he says that business is good and that he has entirely recovered from the injury to his leg which he received when last he was visiting his son on a boat of a log while guiding a party of some people to Clear Lake. Prof. and Mrs. Warren D. Smith, of Eugene, were in Gardiner Tuesday on their vacation. They are visiting distant relatives of interest. They spent a few days at Winchester Bay and were delighted with the new creek and beach. From there they left for Coos Bay, after which they expect to return here and go out on the way of Southport. Prof. Smith is of the department of geology, University of the West.
