LAST PILING DRIVEN ON W. P. RAILROAD

It was just one year ago on that day since the crew began work on the bridge that spans the Umpqua River and Smith River. The bridge work and trestle will be finished by the last of the month. The only unfinished work remaining is the finishing of the spans across a part of Smith River. This does not refer to the work which is going on across the lakes between Smith River and the Siuslaw, where draws are being put in, which will probably take all winter to complete, but this work does not interfere with train service.—Gardner Courier.

CHANGE IN THE SMITH RIVER MAIL SERVICE

The mail service on Smith River has been changed so that beginning last Monday all of the Smith River mail will be routed from Reedport to Sulphur Springs, instead of from Gardiner as has been done before. The Smith River people will get their mail three times a week—Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays. The mail boat will leave Sulphur Springs on the morning of the days mentioned, returning in the afternoon of the same day. This being a rural delivery route, the mail will be distributed as before. Mail for Sulphur Springs and along Smith River will leave Gardiner at 1 p. m., reaching Reedport in time to catch the mail boat to Sulphur Springs.—Gardner Courier.

SALEM, Ore., Oct. 16.—Oregon's total registration for the general election next month will be approximately 275,000, or nearly 30,000 below the 1914 registration, according to estimates by Secretary of State Obert.
