MONSTER AIRPLANES
DESIGNED BY THE U. S.

WASHINGTON, July 12.—Monster airplanes of a hitherto unheard-of power and carrying capacity are being designed by Uncle Sam's aviation experts as the next step in our aviation program.

These new planes, to be used for night bombing purposes, will be of 800, 1200 and 1600-horsepower and will be able to carry up to three tons of high explosives. They will be driven respectively by two, three and four Liberty motors each.

Work on the design of these planes may properly be begun now, as actual production of the Liberty motor day bomber is now coming along in better shape. One factory alone, in the last week in June, averaged more than 20 completed "Haviland" bombers each day, the week's shipments from this plant numbering 140 planes. All went direct to France, and each was completely equipped with Liberty motor, synchronized and flexible machine-guns, bomb-carrying apparatus, etc.

HUNS PLAN TO RETAKE JERUSALEM AND BAGDAD.

LONDON, July 11.—The Terrible "Turk" is preparing for a "great" offensive in Mesopotamia and Palestine to take place in the autumn, after the summer's heat lifts and permits a resumption of the fighting in the desert country.

This is the news from General Allenby's forces in Palestine. The Turks are said to be preparing on a great scale for a drive southward through northwestern Persia and northeastern Asiatic Turkey to recapture Bagdad and Jerusalem from the British.

The capture of Bagdad by General Maude last year rankles in the Turkish breast, and the loss of Jerusalem is no less keenly felt. Not only are the Turks anxious to recover the two famous cities, but the Germans have let it be known that they will not "permit" Jerusalem to remain in British hands.
