CASUALTY LIST REPORT.
 WASHINGTON, Sept. 21 -- Army casualties reported today total 277. There were 42 killed in action, 108 missing in action, 88 wounded severely, 12 died of wounds, 12 died of disease or accident, one wounded slightly.
 Four Oregon men were included in the list. Louis Henry Stinson, of Astoria, died of disease; Frank Ward, of Nyssa, and Erik M. Elliott, of Portland, were wounded severely. Total number of casualties to date including those reported above:

 Died of wounds 1860
 Died of disease 1795
 Died of accident or other cause 552
