OLCOTT NAMES EMMONS AS PRIVATE SECRETARY.

SALEM, March 20.—Dan H. E. John, who for several years has been Salem correspondent for the Oregonian, has been appointed by Governor Olcott as his private secretary, and he will succeed to the office of private secretary to the Governor, Chester A. Moores, of Portland, who served Governor Withycombe in that capacity. Mr. Moores was urged, says a statement from the Governor's office, to remain in the state's service, but preferred to accept a business offer in Portland. In announcing the appointment of his new secretary, Governor Olcott said: "I have selected Mr. E. John for the post of private secretary because of his intimate knowledge of the administration of state affairs. He has a keen grasp of legislative subjects and a familiarity with state functions. I have been a personal friend of Mr. E. John from virtually the time he came to Oregon and I think that the knowledge of state activities which he will bring to the new position will be an asset to the office and to the state."
