OLE HANSON, SEATTLE'S FIGHTING MAYOR, MAKES TOUR FOR VICTORY LOAN

Ole Hanson, Seattle's fighting mayor, who gave an address under the auspices of the Portland Press Club at the public auditorium, was heard by about two thousand people Friday night. Speaking on the subject of "Americanism and Bolshevism," it was a strong presentation of the necessity of Americanism for the safety of the country. It was the forerunner of a lecture tour in the east in behalf of the Victory loan.

Mayor Hanson spoke briefly of the affairs of the Seattle strike, declaring the personal leadership was that of men who are opposed to all government. It was the leadership and not the mass of workmen of Seattle, upon which responsibility should be placed, he declared, and the workers were the victims but deserve credit for the promptness with which they repudiated the false leadership.

Arguing that it was the duty of every red blooded American to buy Victory bonds, Mayor Hanson expressed conviction that the man who refuses to finance his share of the debt of honor is to be regarded more seriously than slackers in preceding loans. "This," said the mayor, "is the supreme test of citizenship. It is a debt of honor that the American people have assumed through their government and the man who refuses to do his part must have his Americanism questioned."

Mr. Hanson starts on his eastern tour immediately and will devote his time to the cause during the official campaign period.

Loeuan Cole was an Oakland visitor the first of the week.

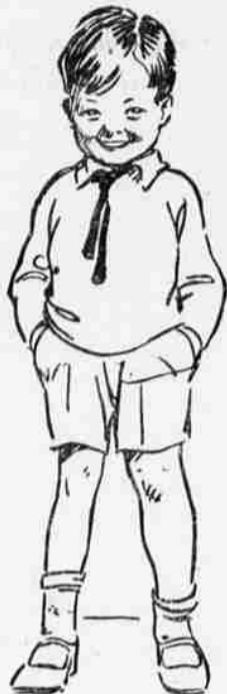

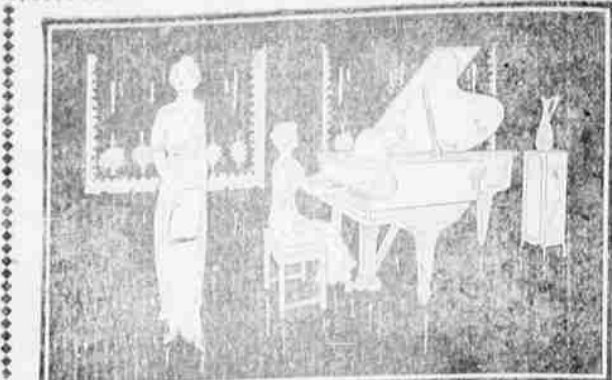


The Zedlers are enhanced by the use of a specially constructed reed organ. When combined with the piano and stringed instruments the result and with effects of a large orchestra are secured.
