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**SOUTHERN OREGON TO BE
 WIDELY ADVERTISED;
 WIDE PUBLICITY PLAN**

Tuesday night one of the most important plans that has been devised for putting Southern Oregon on the map as a tourist country was launched at a meeting of the commercial clubs of Grants Pass, Medford and Ashland, as represented by a committee of five from each of the clubs.

During a three hour session, plans were made to advertise the tourist and scenic resources of Southern Oregon jointly, the expense to be borne by the three clubs on an equal basis. The organization was made under the title, "The Southern Oregon Association," composed of the commercial bodies of the three cities. The organization will be permanent as a department of each club.

The object is to develop and advertise the Southern Oregon climate and scenery. The first activity will be proper literature setting forth the advantages of this section as to climate, healthfulness, scenic beauty and the like with the object of establishing Southern Oregon as a resort for health and recreation seekers.

It was the feeling of the committee that climate, scenery and healthfulness was Southern Oregon's big asset and that when properly and persistently presented to the world would become more famous than Southern California.

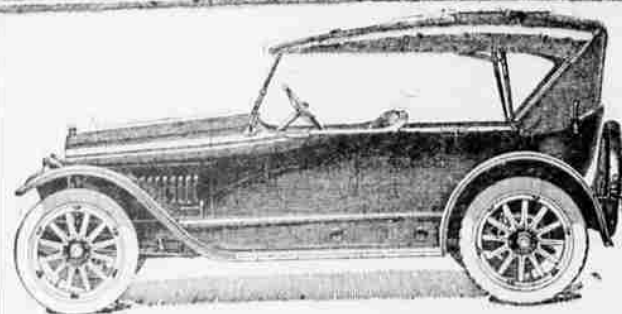
