OLYMPIC GAMES WILL PLAY PART

1920 Olympia Will Assist in Reconstruction of the War Savings

EXPECT MANY VISITORS

Games Will Be Staged in the Arena of the Antwerp Stadium—King Albert of the Belgians Will Participate.

ANTWERP, March 30.—Quite apart from the sporting viewpoint, and the possibilities of national athletic triumphs, Belgium expects to turn the 1920 Olympiad to commercial account in the reconstruction of a war-ravaged country. Such is the frank admission of Count de Baillet-Latour, president of the Antwerp Olympic committee, himself the keenest of sportsmen, who however is under no delusions as to amount of interest displayed in sport by his countrymen, generally.

Interviewed by the United Press Count de Baillet-Latour declared: "The Olympic games are going to play a big part in the reconstruction of Belgium, inasmuch as participants and spectators will include men from all parts of the world, who will use the opportunity thus offered to open up new business prospects.

"The war has shown the value of sport as an aid to physical development, and the more widely sport is recognized the more popular it will become. This year Belgium is going to help to popularize sport, and incidentally she will thus help in the reconstruction of her own industry. In point of fact the Antwerp Olympic games promise to make good throughout France as well.

"For example, a manifesto has been issued by the French National Sports federation urging all young men in all branches of sport to go into hard training right away, so as to uphold at Antwerp the honors already gained by France at Athens and Stockholm. The Swiss government is giving a subvention of 15,000 francs in aid of the Swiss share of the work at Antwerp, and this will be supplemented by a national subscription organized by the Swiss Sports federation. Fourteen big Swiss sporting organizations are already booked for Antwerp."

Regarding Belgium's contribution to the games, Count de Baillet-Latour declared, "Belgium itself, in so far as the man in the street is concerned, cares little for sport. He does not see the necessity for it. The average Belgian cannot differentiate, for example, between boxing and fighting; between tennis and lawn-tennis. Yet the en-

RUSSIAN SOVIET GOVERNMENT FILES SUIT.

SAN FRANCISCO, March 31.—The Russian soviet government today brought suit in the United States court here for \$50,000 damages, declared to have been sustained thru detention of the steamer Rogdal in this port. Negotiations for the suit have been carried on through Ludwig Mercus, soviet "ambassador" to the United States. This is said to be the first suit brought in a United States court in which the soviet government presents itself as a sovereign power, and asks equal rights in the courts with other world nations. It is seen here as an attempt to force recognition of the soviet government by the United States courts, and take the matter out of the hands of the state department.

PROPAGANDA CIRCULATED

THE HAGUE. (By the Associated Press)—The Bolsheviks are conducting a strong campaign against America, England and France by the skillful use of huge propaganda posters in Moscow, says G. Nipels, correspondent of the Amsterdam Handelsblad who visited Soviet Russia this winter. He found much to admire from a artistic standpoint in the designs of which he saw many in the railway stations.

"This poster campaign is certainly a very clever piece of work," he writes. "Both the educated and unlettered classes are struck by them, the first by the writing beneath, the second by the drawings themselves. The campaign was directed along three great lines: First, to cultivate hatred, loathing and fear for
