

Experiments at Last Prove Effective and Thousands of Coyotes Have Been Killed as a Result-Pelts Bring Money.

Ranchers of Douglas county will read with interest the new discovery made by the chemists of the U. S. aboratories, who have been work-ing on a preparation which will ex-

minate eminate coyotes. Those who are familiar with the habits of these producery animals are aware that it is almost impossiare aware that it is almost impossi-ble to spread poison they will cat or oven alter eating cannot be thrown of. They have a sense of smell and taske for poison and as for traps this has been found entirely im-practible. As a result the coyoites have increased in many sections un-til they are a distinct menace to the cattle and sheep industry. New Poison Tasteless, Government Inboratories at Albu-

Government Inhoratories at Albu-querque have been experimenting on poison that has at inst proven ective. It consists of strychnine, offective. sugar of milk and birarhonate of soda compressed into small tablets, which are inserted into pleces of meat taken from a carcass. The car-

cass is then dragged across country. case is then dragged acress country and the poison pleces permitted to drop at intervals of several hundred level. Although suspicious of the dead animal the coyotes will pick wo the bits of meat and eat it.as there is no taste or kineli to give them warning of the poison. When the poison once reaches the storage the poison once reaches the stomach the lablet forms a gas and death follows in 30 seconds, far too sudden for the animal to throw of1 the






