GIVES TO NEAR EAST RELIEF.
At its social session yesterday afternoon, the Presbyterian Ladies' Aid voted a contribution of \$25 to the Near East relief. Mr. Bruce, field secretary of the campaign for Douglas county, gave a short talk. He spoke of the effects of momentum of moving bodies. In the same way the distress caused by the great war acquires momentum so that the climax of suffering is reached some time after the war is closed. Authorities state that more people are dying in one year since the war closed than died during the entire war. Armenia has lost a large part

of its population of four and one-half million. Without the prompt help of America there will be only about a half-million left.
