Maple Leaf Confectionery Is Sold

The general move of business houses in the city has extended to the Maple Leaf Confectionery store the deal for the purchase of which was consummated today, Mrs. J. H. Rankin, the present owner, has disposed of the business to A. H. Edwards & Bro., of Corvallis, who will take possession about the 1st of May. Both young men are at the present time employed in the dispensing department of Andrews and Korns, the well known Corvallis confectionery. They are experienced soda fountain experts, having made that work an especial study for the past three years, and expect to add many new features to the soda fountain of the Maple Leaf. The new proprietors are only 23 and 21 years of age, and are ex-service men. They have three younger brothers who will probably accompany them to this city and assist in the new business. They have not signified their intentions at the present time of making extensive improvements, other than increasing the capacity and adding more booths on the intersection. Mrs. Rankin, who has been proprietor of the candy kitchen since last September, is planning on taking an extended trip soon by automobile, and also visiting in Spokane with her mother, Mrs. Albert Schanze. Her sister, Mrs. Della Mills, and son, will accompany her.

Stage Line to Start Monday
