Timber Men Meet Here Today

Over twenty-five timber men representing companies holding tracts in this county were present this morning at a meeting of the Douglas county court at which time the matter of increasing the assessed valuation of timber lands was discussed. They came in response to a letter sent out by Assessor F. L. Calkins, who is preparing a new schedule of assessment which will put timber on a more equitable basis. The timber owners stated that they feel they have been given a square deal in Douglas county and believe that any adjustment of timber values made by Mr. Calkins and the county court will prove equitable. They expressed their belief that the value should be increased in order that timber and other property may be put in proper proportion, it being stated, however, that the basis of valuation should be fixed on a pro rata standard so that merchantable timber and timber which at present is inaccessible should not bear the same rate of taxation. This matter will be worked out later along the lines laid down this morning.

Auto Dealers May Organize

Robert E. Magner, field secretary for the National Automobile Dealers association, came to the city today to organize the local dealers and to take their membership into the organization which is standing for the protection of the dealer and the promotion of legislation favorable to the motorist.

Problems confronting the automobile dealers are more numerous and serious now than they were during the war when the war trade board classified the automobile as a non-essential and seriously considered closing up dealers' establishments. Through strenuous efforts made by the National Automobile Dealers association, the automobile was removed from the non-essential list. "The dealers of the country are facing the possibility that automobiles sold to customers on credit will be confiscated by the federal government if found with liquor upon which the federal revenue has not been paid. A federal statute passed 60 years ago authorized this confiscation and two United States circuit courts of appeal have ruled that it applies to automobiles, under the word "vehicle." A dealer will not even be allowed to be heard to set up his claim to a car seized under this statute, regardless of the fact

The passage in congress of the Pittman bill, providing for a universal license in the United States, which means that when an autoist complies with all the laws and requirements of his home state, no other state can tax or license his car. "One country, one flag, one license tag."

PORTLAND, Ore., April 21.—Fred Fulton, Minnesota heavyweight boxer, received the decision here tonight in the sixth round of his scheduled 10-round bout against Jack Thompson, Tulsa, Okla., negro, when the latter went down twice, partly from blows and partly from exhaustion.

"Tiny" Herman Tacoma heavyweight, knocked out "Mexican Joe" Lawson, New York 185-pound negro, in the second round of a scheduled 10-round fight in the semi-windup. A right chop to the chin turned the trick.

Joe Gorman, Portland featherweight, knocked out Frank Pete, of Seattle, in the third round of a scheduled six-round fight. A right cross to Pete's chin put him out.

Johnny Noye, St. Paul lightweight, fought a six-round draw with Muff Bronson, of Portland.

Kid Meeker and Henry Krieger, Portland welterweights, fought a four-round draw.
