HOMESTEADS FOR CRIPPLED SOLDIERS

Representative Sinnott of Oregon Makes Speed Record Last Week.

AIDS EX-SERVICE MEN

Wounded and Ill Vets of the Late War Will Not Lose Homes They Started to Acquire Before Their Enlistment.

WASHINGTON, April 16.—(Special to the News-Review).—In an effort to save the homesteads of crippled soldier boys, Representative Nick Sinnott of Oregon made a legislative speed record this week. On April 12th Secretary of the Interior Payne told Sinnott he would favor legislation which "the gentleman from Oregon" had suggested to the department, allowing ex-service men homesteaded entries prior to enlistment and as a result of their service had become physically incapacitated so they could not return to their claims to acquire title to the lands by commutation on payment of price fixed by law, without further residence or cultivation.

All Auto Owners Must Have License

On and after July 1 every person owning or driving an automobile will be required to have a license. Those engaged as chauffeurs must take out the regular chauffeur's license and all others who drive for themselves or who are driving a car for someone else must obtain a license which will cost the sum of 25 cents.

The law was passed by the recent legislature and is contained in the session laws put out following the recent special session. It is provided that no person under the age of 16 years shall drive a car and that all above that age who desire to operate an automobile must first have an operator's license. This applies to owners of cars and those who are driving borrowed or rented machines. Operators are required to have had five days' experience in driving under a competent instructor before a license is granted.

WHAT FORM OF TAXATION IS THIS?

To the Editor of the Roseburg News-Review:

One of our ex-county commissioners, who is now an aspirant to the nomination for state representative, in the year 1918 had a stock ranch in T. 30 S., R. 1 W., W. M. of 800 acres. It was assessed in his wife's name at a valuation of \$2,565, and paid \$42.77 in taxes, the ranch being equipped with buildings, corrals and some fencing.

During the year of 1918 this ranch was stocked with 118 head of assessable cattle, wherefrom one carload was sold in the Portland market at top prices, bringing \$3,500 for the carload.

For the year 1918 there were entered for assessment 20 head of cattle of a valuation of \$900, taxes \$9.92.

These cattle should have been assessed in T. 30 S., R. 1 W., W. M., but the assessment was entered in T. 30 S., R. 6 W., W. M., 42 miles from where the cattle were located.

The assessment roll shows us no personal property on this ranch for 1918 yet the tax rolls show that taxes were paid on 2 head of cattle in T. 30 S., R. 1 W., W. M.

Will somebody please figure out what system of taxation we have in Douglas county and then name it?

With all due regards I respectfully submit it to those whose ability in mathematics, and knowledge of taxation, and authority of valuations, permits them to decipher it.

LOS ANGELES, April 21.—James R. Hurt, alleged bigamist, will demand that the state show cause for detaining him as soon as he recovers from self-inflicted wounds at the Los Angeles county hospital, according to a statement tonight by his counsel. Hurt's condition was said to be improving.

Deputy Sheriff A. L. Manning, who has charge of the investigation of the alleged marriages of Hurt, today received from the chief of police at Salem, Oregon, three photographs of a man declared to have married Catherine Cruse in that city in 1913. Mr. Manning said Hurt was the man who had posed for the photographs.

In an interview which the Examiner will print tomorrow, Hurt said his real name is Walter Andrew and that he was born in Dallas, Texas, in 1876.
