## FESTIVAL PLANS ARE UNDER WAY

Strawberry Festival Will Be One of the Best Ever Known In County.

### CIRCUS IS A FEATURE

Carnival Shows Carry Attractive Concessions of a Standard Well Pleasing to All Those Who Attend the Attractions.

The routine work of the coming strawberry carnival is well in hand and the wheels have been put in motion to produce one of the best celebrations that the city has known. The committee has taken active charge of the work and with C. S. Heintz in the position of secretary, the event is an assured success.

One feature this year is to be the Foley and Burke shows. Without doubt this is the best carnival company in the west, and a set of high class concessions will be presented for the entertainment of those in attendance at the festival. The carnival company carries a two-ring circus, which is said to be a "dandy." It also has a good sized band of accomplished musicians and this band will participate in all of the festival parades as well as furnishing concerts and providing music at the shows.

The "Joy Trail," which is the feature of these shows, is a path of merit and is replete with thrills of the kind that are clean and wholesome. There are twenty-five separate and distinct concessions, including a large merry-go-round and Ferris wheel. There are the usual pit shows and the "fat lady," taking "six men to hug this specimen of human obesity." In addition to all these the Foley and Burke shows carry a corps of trained barkers that for noise can outdo anything on the coast. This outfit is far ahead of the standard of shows formerly in attendance at the annual festivals, and a good time is assured all those who desire to enjoy this event.

The parades this year will be better than usual, as the prizes are to be more substantial and well worthy of an effort. Especial interest is to be shown in the school parade and a large sum of money is to be divided among the various educational institutions in order to provide costumes and decorations. The children intend to bring about some good natured rivalry during the contest for junior queen, and it is expected that a large quantity of buttons will be needed. Hats will not be sold this year and efforts will be centered in disposing of the festival badges.

Fraternal organizations are showing a great deal of interest in the parade to be given on fraternal day, and several hundred people will be in line. The labor organizations and American Legion will parade this year, in addition to the lodges, and this will considerably augment the ranks of the marchers.

Altogether the coming festival promises to be one of the best Douglas county has ever known, and with the co-operation of all Roseburg residents there is no doubt but that it will go over with a pop and punch that will herald the name of Roseburg from one end of the coast to the other.

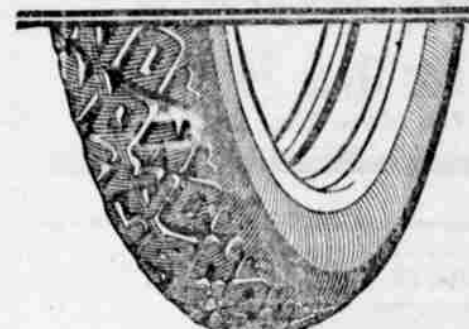

## Sugar Prices High During Civil War.

The following letter regarding sugar prices during the civil war period, showing the comparison with present day prices, was received today by Everybody's Exchange company from the Eugene branch of the Allen & Lewis company:

We are today in receipt of the following sugar information which will, no doubt, be of interest to you.

In view of the present high prices for both raw and refined sugar, the following table shows highest prices paid for sugar since 1840, according to our records:

1864 (Civil War) Granulated, high	20.00
Low	16.87 1/2
Raw, high	21.75
Raw, low	12.87 1/2
1865 (Civil War) granulated, high	28.50
Low	18.00
Raw, high	19.12 1/2
Raw, low	12.00

In 1861, at the beginning of the civil war, the consumption in the United States was 490,745 tons, which decreased to 275,260 tons in 1864. In 1865 the consumption was 322,194 tons.

It will be seen that sugar was not used as freely as it is today, as the consumption for 1919 was 4,967,671 tons. The population figures for the corresponding years—in 1860, 31,443,000; in 1919, 106,871,000. So while the population only increased 3 1/2 times, sugar consumption has increased from 8 to 12 times over the average of the civil war period.
