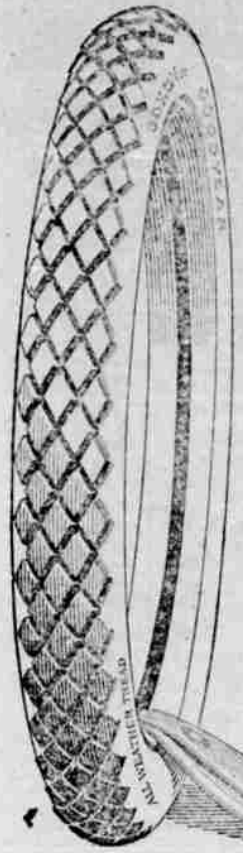

## War Profits Tax To Pay Soldiers

WASHINGTON, April 26.—A retroactive tax on war profits has been definitely agreed on by house democrats and insurgent republicans to raise funds for soldier relief legislation. Representative Rainey, democrat, Illinois, and Johnson, republican, South Dakota, in a statement tonight announced a bill would be introduced tomorrow providing for collection of the tax.

The plan of the republican leaders has not been finally agreed on, but its main provision probably will be imposition of a one per cent tax on sales. The battle on financing soldier bonus legislation, scheduled to come before the house May 3, promises to hinge on these two conflicting schemes.

Under the bill to be submitted tomorrow, an 80 per cent tax will be levied on individual and corporate incomes "over and above the pre-war income," with an exemption of \$20,000 for individuals and \$100,000 for corporations.

"In case of an individual," the bill proposes, "the term 'war profits' means the amount by which his average net income for the taxable years 1917, 1918, 1919 and 1920, less his average income, war profits and excess profits taxes for such years exceed his average net income for the pre-war period (the calendar years of 1911, 1912 and 1913) plus or minus, as the case may be, 10 per cent of the difference between its average increased capital for the pre-war period and for its average invested capital for the years 1917, 1918, 1919 and 1920."

Mr. Rainey said the measure would raise \$2,000,000,000 for carrying out the soldier relief.

"In case of a corporation of existence during the pre-war period the term 'war profits' means the amount by which its net available income for the taxable years 1917, 1918, 1919 and 1920, less its average income, war profits and excess profits taxes for such years exceed its average net income for the pre-war period (the calendar years of 1911, 1912 and 1913) plus or minus, as the case may be, 10 per cent of the difference between its average increased capital for the pre-war period and for its average invested capital for the years 1917, 1918, 1919 and 1920."

Mr. Rainey said the measure would raise \$2,000,000,000 for carrying out the soldier relief.

## 1914 Prices Are Compared 1920

WASHINGTON, April 27.—A comparison of the average prices received March 1, 1914 and March 1, 1920 by producers in the United States of eight important agricultural products, made by the bureau of crop estimates of the department of agriculture, shows the following increases: Cotton, 206 per cent; wheat, 173 per cent; corn, 116 per cent; potatoes, 244 per cent; hay, 11 per cent; eggs, 96 per cent; butter, 116 per cent; wool, 231 per cent.

## Salvage Party to Hunt For Treasures

By Associated Press. VANCOUVER, B. C., April 27.—To delve into the unknown depths of the sea off the west coast of Vancouver Island and wrest therefrom the treasures hidden for many years, is the object of S. Madison and his party of salvagers who will begin operations early in May.

Last autumn Madison made submarine cruises along the coast which line the coast of the island and located four large wrecks besides a number of smaller ones.

Two of the larger he identified as the Pas-of-Melford and the Valencia, and one of the others he thinks is the long lost H. M. S. Condor, which disappeared in 1903 and has not been heard of since.
