302 X Yes **CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT**—Referred to the people by the
Legislature Assembly.

303 No **LIMITATION OF FOUR PER CENT STATE INDEBTEDNESS**
FOR PERMANENT ROADS—For the stated purpose of
Article XI of the Constitution of the State of Oregon so as to permit the
creation of debtless facilities including previous debt and liabilities
for the purpose of building and maintaining permanent roads to the
amount of four per cent of the assessed valuation of all the property
in the State of Oregon, limited to two per cent as now provided by law.

NO PROPERTY TAX—NO DIRECT TAX
NO INCREASE IN AUTO LICENSE FEES
NO INCREASE OF GASOLINE TAX

Keep these three facts in mind. The present auto license fees and gasoline tax will pay both the principal and interest on all the bonds under this amendment, and will yield an annual surplus besides for other state highway work. No additional taxation of any kind.

FEDERAL FUNDS MUST BE MATCHED

Oregon must have sufficient Highway Funds to match Federal apportionments or Oregon cannot get the benefit of Federal money for Oregon Roads. Increasing this constitutional limit is a necessity. Unless limit is increased, without state road bonds, no new roads, no new yards, or must be financed by direct property taxation. This measure would direct property tax for state highways and makes early completion possible. Let's get the roads built now.

Income from Present Sources Sufficient to Pay Principal and Interest

The fact that revenue from State Income Tax and gasoline tax, without increase of present rates, will be enough to pay both principal and interest on the \$60 million bonds is a very important factor. The State Finance Act, passed by a vote of 78-19, has been approved by the voters. It is now law.
