Will Find Work For Ex-Soldiers

A free employment service to aid ex-soldiers to get in touch with jobs has been started by the Lawrence-Cordon real estate company. The action has been made necessary because of the large number of ex-soldiers who have been lured to this city by the expectation of securing homestead land and who upon arriving and making an extensive investigation find themselves broke and unemployed. There are undoubtedly a large number of jobs open in the county and there are certainly a great many men without jobs. There are ex-service men who want to work and who are entitled to good jobs. The majority of them want farm work and as farm labor is at a premium there will probably be little difficulty in finding positions for these men. The Lawrence-Cordon company will endeavor to place men out of employment and will do this without remuneration. Persons desiring to employ help in any branch of work can co-operate by letting the office know of the vacancy that exists and in this manner a great many deserving ex-soldiers can be given work.

First Ripe Berries Are Reported Today

What are believed to be the first ripe strawberries of the season were picked by G. H. Wilson on the hillside near his place in Alexander Park yesterday. The berries were wild, but there are lots of them. Mr. Wilson stated today, and of the finest kind for the unacclimated sort. The berry season is fully three weeks late this year, as ordinarily strawberries come on by the middle of April. Cold and unfavorable weather conditions this spring have delayed this luscious fruit, but in a few days the cultivated varieties will begin to ripen here. Mr. Wilson stated that he has about eight thousand plants in his garden, and under the warm sunshine of the past week they are rapidly coming to a mature condition. Generally throughout the berry districts of the county a big crop is anticipated, and it is believed there will be lots of the fruit by the time the Strawberry Carnival date rolls around.

Twilight League Season to Start

The twilight league season is to start within a short time and the schedule will be announced within the next few days. At an executive meeting last night several matters were given consideration, Bruce Bridges, L. J. Reizenstein, Andy Matthews and Story Iles being elected official umpires and Chas. Stanton official score keeper. There is a possibility that there will be only three teams this year, the Christian, Baptist and Presbyterian, the Methodists as yet having failed to secure a suitable lineup. However, an effort will be made to bring in the fourth team, but if not the league will be continued with the three organizations. The three teams now in the league are stronger than ever before and some of the players have been practicing in spite of the fact that the grounds at present are in very poor condition. Within a short time the diamond will be scraped and put in readiness for the season's play and practice will be started. A great deal of new material has been secured and interest is keen in the work of the twilight league. Some good games are assured and the season will probably start about carnival time as in previous years.

Big Audience Hears Evangelist Rippey

SUTHERLIN, May 6.—(Special)—With an increasing attendance and interest at the Seventh Day Adventist meetings, which began Sunday evening, Evangelist Rippey spoke last night on the subject of Christ's return. From John 14 he showed that Christ promised to return to this earth, and that this has been the desire of all ages. He also stated that there were many other scriptures where prophets and apostles had spoken of the second coming of Christ. The speaker demonstrated that the coming would be personal and literal, using the following scriptures as proof: Psalms 3:5; Acts 1:9-11; Rev. 1:7; John 20:19-15 and 25-27. From these scriptures the evangelist proved that Christ would come as a man in the clouds of heaven just as he went away, and that we would know him by the print of the nails in his hands, which he would carry throughout eternity. From 1 Thes. 4:13-17, 2 Thes. 1:7-9, and 2:8, he proved that the righteous dead would be raised at Christ's second coming and that the righteous living would be translated at that time, while the wicked would fall dead because of the brightness of His coming. Isaiah 29:4 and Jeremiah 4:23-24 were cited to show that this old world would be completely broken up at Christ's coming. The subject tonight will be "The Signs of His Coming."
