## EXPECT WORK TO START ABOUT JUNE 1

Believed Construction Can be Completed at Originally Estimated Cost.

### SURVEY IS COMPLETED

Engineer Intimates That Report on Project Will be Favorable for Early Resumption of Work—Much Desired Road.

Before returning to Portland, after completing his survey of the Tiller cut off road, Engineer Beasley intimated that his report will be favorable for the early resumption of construction on the proposed highway. It is said that the estimate of \$65,000 first made was very liberal and, in fact, it is believed that at that time the road could be built for much less than that amount. With increased costs, however, it becomes a question whether or not the work can be done for that sum and if not the government probably will do nothing until the construction can be done at its original estimate.

Although no definite announcement was made, it was intimated that the engineers ascertained that the cut can be made for the sum originally estimated and will so report. If this is the fact, work will probably be begun about the first of June and will be rushed to completion. The upper end of the road will be opened in order to provide a route so that cars may start through within a short time.

The residents of Douglas county are very anxious to see this road opened in order that the Crater lake country may become more easily accessible, as well as that a detour may be provided when the canyon road is closed for paving. In the event the highway is blocked for any considerable length of time, cities and towns along the route will lose heavily from the loss of the tourist travel, but if a detour can be provided there will be no loss.

The Crater lake route by way of Tiller will also bring the Klamath Falls and Bend country many miles nearer Roseburg, insofar as length of travel is concerned, and the change of route will doubtless mean a great many dollars to this community because of that fact.

The forest service has turned this project over to the bureau of public roads but is showing a great interest in the matter as it is desired to see the road brought to an early completion. In the event the estimate of a few years ago is not exceeded by the one recently made, there is no doubt but that the work will be resumed in the very near future.

## Cal Mermaids Win Honors

## Electric Farm Machinery Saves

The development of electric labor-saving machinery for the farm has brought to light some very interesting figures. Take for instance the matter of pumping and carrying water. For all household purposes such as drinking, cooking, washing, scrubbing and cleansing, the average farm family will use about 7 gallons per person each day or 42 gallons for a family of six. Now 42 gallons of water weigh 336 pounds and if those 42 gallons were pumped and carried only 300 days out of the year, it will mean that some one will have to pump and carry 160,800 pounds, or over 50 tons of water every year. Furthermore, if a 3-gallon bucket is used it will mean 14 trips to the well every day, and if the well is 15 feet from the house, this will mean 30x14 or 420 feet daily. In the 300 days this will amount to 126,000 feet or nearly 24 miles.
