Mr. Dimmick was a member of one of the largest pioneer families of the state and leaves a number of brothers, sisters and other relatives as well as a host of friends and acquaintances to mourn his death. He was a member of both the I. O. O. F. and Masonic lodges.

None Exempt From Judgement

Evangelist O. H. Shrewsbury spoke to an attentive audience last night on the subject of "The Judgment and the Standard Revealed in the World." He said in part: "II Cor. 5:10 declares that 'all must appear before the judgment seat of Christ.' It is compulsory. All must appear. None are exempt. Small or great, rich or poor, learned or ignorant, no matter who you are, you must appear before the bar of God. "The reason God can rightfully summon you to judgment is because He owns you and all that you have. You may not acknowledge this truth but it makes no difference, yourself and all that you have belongs to God. Deut. 8:18. "The standard in the judgment will be the ten commandments as exemplified in the life of Christ. Psal. 12:13, 14, Jas. 2:8-12, Acts 17, 30, 31, Dan. 7, 9, 10, give us a picture of the judgment scene. "We are opened and all are judged by their record. There books are kept by the angels, one of whom accompanies each human being. Eccl. 5, 6. Every idle word must be accounted for, the sharp stinging words, the harsh, scolding words, the deceitful, lying words. The heart will be laid bare in that day. "The judgment begins with cases of the Christians, I Peter, 4:17, and ends with the cases of the wicked and fallen angels. "Revelation 14:6, 7, tells us that the day of God's judgment 'is come.' 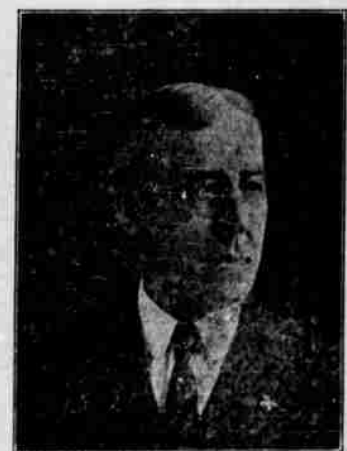
