ELECTION, MAY 21 STATE ROADS Vote 302 X Yes For 4% State Road Bond Limit

BALLOT TITLE IS AS FOLLOWS: 302 X Yes CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT—Submitted to the people by the Legislative Assembly. LIMITATION OF FOUR PER CENT STATE DEBT FOR FURNISHING ROAD-BUILDING PURPOSES. For the purpose of building and maintaining, permanent roads in the State of Oregon, not to exceed the amount of four per cent of the State's valuation of all the property in the State at the time of the next general election, to be paid in installments.

NO PROPERTY TAX—NO DIRECT TAX NO INCREASE IN AUTO LICENSE FEES NO INCREASE OF GASOLINE TAX Keep these three facts in mind. The present auto license fees and gasoline tax will pay both the principal and interest on all the bonds under this amendment, and will yield an annual surplus besides for our state highway work. No additional taxation of any kind.

FEDERAL FUNDS MUST BE MATCHED Oregon must have sufficient Highway Funds to match Federal apportionments or Oregon cannot get the benefit of Federal money for Oregon. Increasing this constitutional limit is a necessity. Unless limit is increased, all our state roads cannot be completed for many, many years, or must be funded by direct property taxation. This new amendment directs property tax for state highways and makes early completion possible. Let's get the road built now.

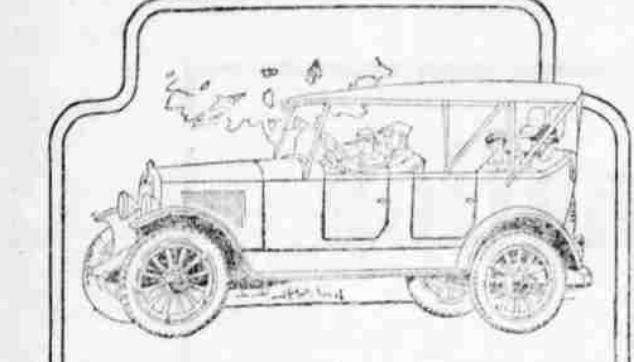
