LANE FIRE PATROL HAS BEEN EXTENDED

Benton County and a Part of Douglas Has Been Annexed to Territory.

WILL BE 12 PATROLMEN

Mt. Roman Nose in Douglas and Prairie Mountain in Lane Will Be Used as Lookout Stations During Season.

EUGENE, May 25.—Through a system of co-operation between the Siuslaw national forest and the Western Lane County Fire Patrol association, the Western Lane organization will be extended to cover Benton county and northern Douglas county as far south as the Umpqua river at Seaside, thence up the river to Elkton, and thence east along the Elk Creek-Umpqua divide to the southwest corner of Lane county east from Youcalla, according to Carl V. Oglesby, supervising warden of the Western Lane County Fire Patrol association.

In the territory now outlined there will be 12 patrolmen and two lookout men. Mt. Roman Nose in

northwestern Douglas, and Prairie mountain, in northern Lane, will be used as lookouts as in the past, and both these stations will be equipped with modern engine and fire ladders. Telephone lines have already been built to these points.

May's peak, in Benton county, may be used part of the season, and will be tried out to determine its value as a lookout point. Benton county has used it for a few years and it is connected up by telephone with Corvallis.

Oglesby to Have Charge.

Mr. Oglesby, who has supervised the Western Lane organization for the past seven seasons, will take charge of the new organization, and is thoroughly familiar with all of the territory. "We expect to get the hearty co-operation of all the residents and operators of the new territory," says Mr. Oglesby. "The same as we have had in Western Lane, as this is the principal factor in the movement of the forest. Too much reliance cannot be given to the residents and operators of western Lane for their assistance in this great work, and this is one of the principal reasons for the enlargement of the western Lane patrol organization. With the lookouts well equipped, together with the air patrol which is practically assured, we should have no trouble in locating any fire that may get started, but we hope there will be none to locate."

Operators and those having old cuttings should burn them before the dry season and thereby protect themselves as well as the timber, and do away with the extra risk that must be constantly watched through the fire season.

CONCESSIONS GIVEN CANNERY COMPANY

City Agrees Vacate Sidewalk Property and Permit Building at Curb Line.

ORDINANCE IS PASSED

Ordinance Conferring Title to Land Upon Company Passed at Special Meeting of Council Called on Monday Night.

An ordinance was passed last night vacating the sidewalk property on Spruce street abutting the proposed Rupert cannery and permitting the company to construct its building immediately adjoining the curb line. The company is getting out its plans and specifications for the cannery building and is desirous of building flush with the curb in order to provide more land for their structure and at the same time permit a more easy access for loading and unloading purposes.

The legal procedure incident with this vacation has been carried on for several weeks and the ordinance disposing of the city's title was read and passed at the special meeting called by the city council last night for the purpose of canvassing the election vote.

The ordinance was passed without opposition and the cannery company will be notified of the action of the council. Attorney Neuner, secretary of the local Rupert organization, appeared for the company and stated that the owners are anxious to start construction at once. They have purchased the entire block and intend to cover all of the property with buildings. The warehouse unit is now under process of construction and will be completed before the end of the summer.

It was provided that the company should be allowed to build up to the curb line of the street but that the eaves of the building, if projecting over the pavement must be protected with troughs in order to prevent drips from striking the pavement and interfering with the comfort of pedestrians.

As the entire block is owned by the cannery company, the lack of a sidewalk on the east side of the street will not seriously inconvenience people passing along that side of the street, and will be a great benefit to the company in the way of space and ease of access.

the surrounding timber, confer with me and immediate steps will be taken to dispose of it."

Headquarters in Eugene.
Mr. Oglesby will make his headquarters in Eugene, and can be located through the Siuslaw national forest office or through the office of the Siuslaw Timber company, at 21 Seventh avenue east.

Continuing, Mr. Oglesby said: "We have a large territory that is unfit for anything except to raise timber, and a large portion of this is reforesting newly, and other portions will soon be reforested if the fire can just be kept out for a few years, while again we have some territory that will have to be cleared up before being allowed to reforest, and we are going to ask the hunter to consider very carefully before setting the dry forest fire. Will the few deer you might kill be worth the great risk of killing millions of feet of timber? You may be the very man that will wish to work in the timber you have destroyed, for labor is the one that suffers the most from burned timber."

SUGAR REFINERS TO STAND TRIAL

Federal Government Starts Action Against Two Concerns in Mass.

JOHNSON LEAD GROWS

Figures at Noon Indicate Californian Carried Oregon by More Than Eleven Hundred Votes—Bishops Are Assigned.

BOSTON, May 25.—The federal government, following a long delay during which time the public has bitterly complained of graft inflicted by special interests, against sugar refiners here for alleged profiteering and hoarding, the Revenue Sugar refinery, through its vice-president, was formally charged with exacting excessive prices and withholding sugar from the market for the purpose of influencing the public to believe in scarcity, so that huge profits might be charged. The American Sugar Refining Co., through its general manager, was regularly charged to the indictment with selling sugar at excessive prices. Complaints against the company named have made millions of dollars by holding products, raising a short market and this way controlling the price.

Johnson Lead Grows.

PORTLAND, May 25.—Tabulations compiled by the Evening Telegram at 11 o'clock this morning give Johnson a lead of 1184 votes over Wood. These figures are from 18 counties complete, 17 counties incomplete, but most of the records in Curry county has not reported. The figures available give Johnson 43,257, and Wood 42,674.

At 1 o'clock Johnson's lead had climbed to 1781 over Wood. These figures represent 21 counties with complete returns. An error in the Multnomah county count gave Johnson a gain of 53, with a loss to Wood of 126, and a net gain to the Californian of 179.

WASHINGTON, May 25.—Walter Vick, who is manager of the presidential campaign for Governor Edwards of New Jersey, denied before the senate investigating committee today that his liquor interests are "underwriting" the governor's campaign.

Battle Continues.

WARSAW, May 25.—Large forces of Russian Bolsheviks who succeeded in crossing the upper Rore in several places during the fighting yesterday, have been driven back across the river with heavy losses, including 400 prisoners captured by the poles, according to a statement issued here yesterday. The enemy attacked along the entire Polish front, but is alleged to have been checked at all points of advance. The fighting continues today, and the Bolsheviks are said to have brought up large bodies of reinforcements, and the Poles now face the largest number of the enemy ever thrown against their lines.

Hearst Wins Case.

ST. PAUL, May 25.—The temporary injunction issued by the U. S. district court of New Mexico, restraining the state council of defense and also certain officials of that state, from interfering with the circulation and sale of the Hearst magazines in New Mexico, was upheld in the United States circuit court of appeals here today.

Officer Arrested.

SAN FRANCISCO, May 25.—Otto Thompson, a prohibition enforcement officer, was placed under arrest in the federal building here today in the belief that he is Hugh Thompson, a former army lieutenant, indicted in New Jersey for alleged making of false claims.

Methods Health Subject Address

in health and disease.

The mental schools hold that the state of mind is the most important single factor for the organism's well being in health and disease.

In defining osteopathy, Dr. Atzen used the words which have been adopted by the profession to state as briefly and plainly as possible the place of the science among the other schools of healing, namely:

"Osteopathy is the name of that system of the healing art which places the chief emphasis on the structural integrity of the body mechanism, as being the most important single factor to maintain the well being of the organism, in health and disease."

Following this introduction, Dr. Atzen analyzed the departments of our physical life and showed clearly



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how the control of our respiration, circulation, digestion, muscular activity, flexibility of the bony structure, elimination, and reproduction are accomplished chiefly by mechanical means and how, when the work of some department as for instance, the department of internal secretion, is chemical, the supply of raw materials out of which the complex substances are created is dependent upon the purely mechanical department of circulation. Similarly the nervous system, the seat of which is in the brain, and the control of which is psychical, can be defeated in its work by the failure of the digestive system to prepare nutritive materials or the circulatory system to carry it to the cells of the nerves or the muscular system to carry out the orders of the motor nerves.

Dr. Atzen paid his tribute to a drug school and the mental school of healing, and in no way minimized their place in the art of healing, but he expressed his conviction that we are living in that period of the history of the healing art when the mechanical form of treatment takes precedence over the other two.

Following this address, Dr. Atzen outlined and explained his method of examination of a patient in order to diagnose the disease, and demonstrated this method upon individual cases.
