

GARDINER WINS IN PORT FIGHT

Only One Reedsport Man Is Elected In Port of Umpqua Commission Battle.

W. P. REED HOLDS OVER

Warren Reed Is Hold Over Member of the Commission and Will Retain Position—Four Vacancies Filled at Election.

In an exceedingly bitter fight and close election, Joseph R. Butler, W. H. Jewett and W. F. Peck have been nominated for the four-year term as port commissioner and Walter Rydell for the two-year term, according to the official count as tabulated by County Clerk Leighton. In the excitement of the presidential race and the county primary election, Douglas county almost overlooked the big fight being waged in the lower river country which resulted in a victory for the Gardiner supporters by only a two-vote margin.

The Port of Umpqua commission is composed of five men elected by the residents within the port boundaries. For many years there has been a constant rivalry between Gardiner and Reedsport and this has had a part in the commission each place endeavoring to gain control. Upon the death of C. E. Ricker, who was serving as president of the commission, Fred Weatherly, vice president, took the chair, where upon the Reedsport faction immediately elected C. McC.

Johnson, a Reedsport man, to the vacancy, giving that place three representatives. The Gardiner men objected and filed suit to oust Johnson and prevent him from expending the funds of the commission. All this occurred prior to the election which was marked by strong campaigning and a great deal of heated interest on both sides. Reedsport was represented by a good many candidates, while Gardiner, Scottsburg, Elkton and other points united in an effort to hold the Reedsport men off the commission. Fire Prevention Week Observed

"Oregon Thought Starters: Help Prevent Forest Fires." is the title of a bulletin issued yesterday at the office of the Umpqua national forest, ancient fire prevention week, which is now being observed. The bulletin reads:

"At a conservative estimate, Oregon's four hundred and fifty billion feet of standing timber is worth \$500,000,000 on the stump. Harvested and cut into lumber its value is increased twenty-fold and becomes \$10,000,000,000.

"According to the 1910 census, Oregon's lumber and timber products were worth \$30,000,000 a year practically one-third of the total value of all industrial production in the state at that time.

"Four million acres of Oregon timber has been needlessly destroyed by fire, thereby depriving the state of some million dollars annually in taxes as well as reducing the life of the lumber industry many years.

"Oregon's forests will provide labor for a large army of sturdy woods men for an indefinite period if properly taken care of. They will furnish the raw material for the construction of homes, furniture, utensils of various sorts, musical instruments, and conveyances such as ships, cars, airplanes, and keep the wheels steadily turning in many wood-using industries, bringing prosperity not only to her own citizens but to those of her neighbors as well.

"Our splendid system of good roads is pulling Oregon out of the mud. Effective forest fire prevention will lift her forests, lakes, and mountains out of the smoke fog which conceals them and give the touring public a chance to enjoy the matchless scenic grandeur of the state. It can be done. Let's do it!"

"Oregon's timber pays a large part of the state's taxes—in some counties the bulk of them. The logging and milling of our timber supports the largest payroll of any industry in the state.

"Burned timber pays neither taxes nor wages, and offers no promise for the future."

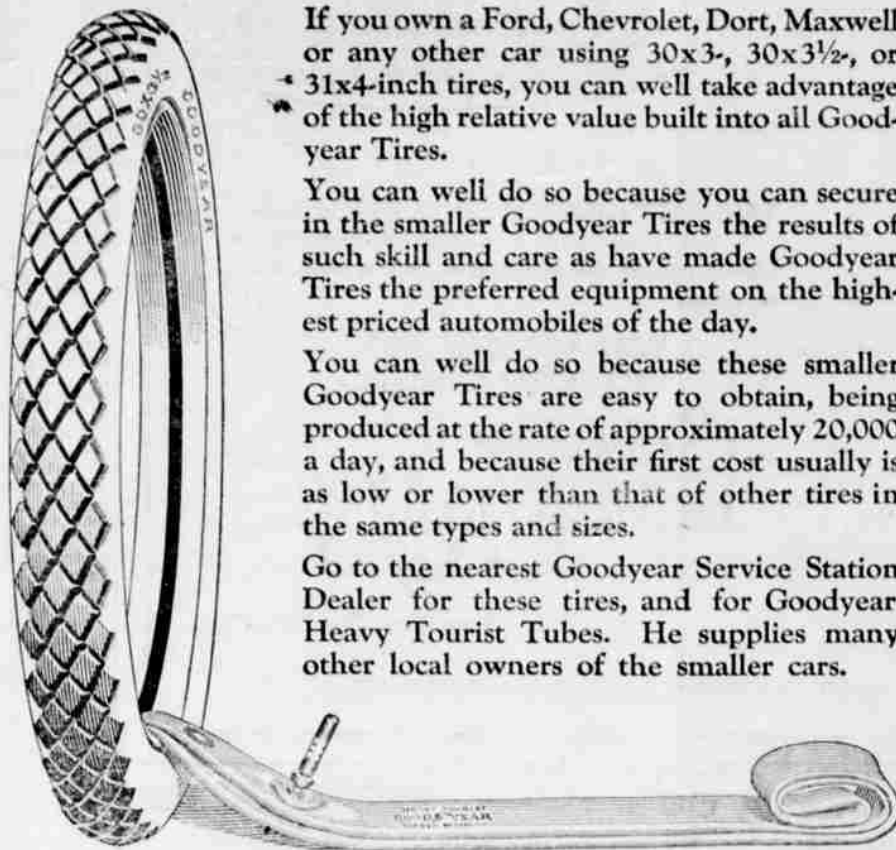
