**AGAINST PROHIBITION**

Purposes of the Club is Outlined in a Press Telegram—Is Not a Religious Proposition—Simply Want Their Booze.

If your throat is dry and parched these days and you have various of a scouner of sassa beer crossing the ear and fading away into the distance, and then you happen to bump into someone wearing on his coat a button bearing the picture of a camel, you can rest assured that the possessor of the button is a fellow partner in distress and is a charter member of the Order of Camels, an organization opposed to prohibition. **ARE MAKING IMPROVEMENTS.**

The Douglas County Light and Water company are this week making several improvements at the power plant at Winchester, according to the manager, Mr. Jennings. The boiler settings are being changed by lowering the grate bars about 16 inches which gives additional depth in the firebox. The depth when the change is completed will be about 48 inches instead of 24 inches as previously. They are also making the grates six feet as they were formerly and the shape of the firebox is being changed to a V-shape instead of square. This was found necessary as the old fireboxes were built for burning coal and as they now stand they will give more space and will be better adapted for burning slab fuel. It will take about three weeks to complete the changes.
