## Secretary Roosevelt Advocates Revision

WASHINGTON, June 21.- Reviaion of the present methods of max-ing appropriations and redistribution of the work of the various executive of the work of the values are recommended by Assistant Secretary Rosservell in a letter to Representative Ireland, roughlen, Illinois, which was made public today at the navy department.

Mr. Boosevelt wrote in reply to an inqury from Mr. Ireland as to whether any reorganizations, reforms or consolidations could be made in the navy department. The assistant secretary did not confine himself to that department. He recommended that concrement congrous:

"Create a true budget system, not the small beginning already attempt-

"Consolidate the appropriations in one general committee, with sub-committees to deal with separate subjects.

"Put into law the general prin-ciples recommended by the reclassi-fication committee's report, together with the authorization of adequate salaries to government employes.

"Invite a conference with the ex-centive branch of the government, looking to a reclassification and re- ing distribution of the work of the de- men.

Give by law greater authority to the fields of the executive depart-ments in conducting their executive business, at the same time holding these heads more directly responsi-ble for the successful administration of their work."
