### SHARESEARN 9 PERCENT

Three Directors Elected and an Auditing Committee Chosen For Ensuing Year—Now Has a Membership of 91.

The annual meeting of the Umpqua Savings and Loan association was held last evening at the office of the secretary, H. O. Fargeter, at which time the third annual report of the association was submitted to the stockholders for their approval. While this is only the third year of the association it has made a wonderful growth and the report displays a good, healthy conservative administration of the affairs of the organization, and it was shown that the stockholders had earned nine percent on their investments for the year ending June 23, 1920, which is considered far above the average considering the fact that this association has been in existence only three years.

After disposing of the secretary's report, which was duly accepted and filed, three directors for the ensuing year were elected as follows: W. F. Harris, L. Wimberly and H. O. Fargeter.
