

COMPLETE CENSUS FIGURES SHOW GAIN

County Has Made Rapid Increase in Population in Past Twenty Years.

ARE MANY NEW CITIES

Government Furnishes A Detailed Statement of Census Tabulation Giving Exact Number in Voting Precincts of the County.

Complete figures on the 1920 census shows the county to have made an excellent growth in the past 20 years. In 1900 the county boasted a population of 14,565. In 1910 the population went to 19,674. The last figures give the county 21,232. The completed census report by voting precincts follows.

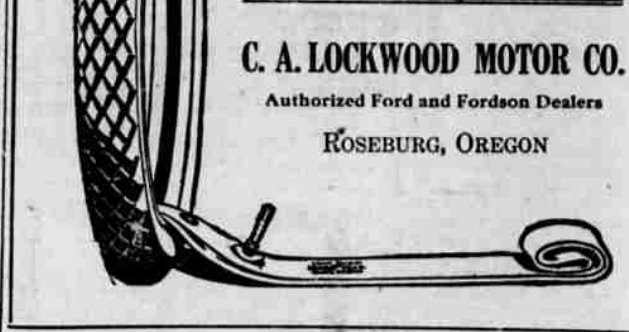

SAN FRANCISCO, July 23—Alaskan dogs are wanted by a party of British explorers who are planning an expedition into the Antarctic according to a letter received by C. E. Darling, of Berkeley, Cal., former Nome, Alaska, dog raiser, from Captain G. H. Williams, a member of the proposed expedition.

John L. Cope, surgeon and biologist of the Sir Ernest Shackleton expedition to the South Pole, is to lead the party, the letter said. The start, it added will be made from New Zealand next fall.

Dogs of the breed wanted by the British expedition are from the same stock as the animals sent to France from Alaska during the war by Darling and A. A. (Scotty) Allan, another Nome dog breeder. The two men developed a team that won the annual Nome, All-Alaska sweepstakes dog derby four times.
