Says County is in Need of the Proposed Institution.

In your paper of the 20th inst. I find an item written by a person who is supposed to live in Wilbur, but I have been unable to find this person who caused to have printed an objection to the new hospital at Winchester. I regret very much indeed that this article has not been answered before, so I take the pleasure of asking why some people always try to down a good, helpful, legitimate cause.

What is wanted in this county and at Winchester is a good, clean-cut hospital and sanitarium, where people outside of Roseburg can go, and where competition can be had. If all enterprises helpful to humanity, labor, etc., is to be turned down by a few individual men that want it all and try to control the county, I say let them keep out of Winchester and let the rest of the county support this new institution.

Do you, or any one feel that these promoters are spending the money, education and their life to come here and spread such contagious and dangerous diseases. No, and you all know it. If I was to meet with a serious accident any time and was bleeding, would I go to a sanitarium? No, to a good hospital and this is one good, big feature, the Winchester hospital.

I think people well know some of the conditions which have arisen during the past year and to have a general hospital would surely be what Douglas County people have for years been crying for and its high time to help these men of integrity and ability to have their dreams realized.

As to the sitting, spitting and loafing around of consumptives in stores and places this is to be taken care of; also the sewerage, etc. What would our fathers, mothers, brother and sisters do if everyone would shut the door in their face? Would you want your own wife or child turned away from the helping hands of others? Is this what you refer to.

I say let us have the best medical aid and help we can get and should spread out our arms to men who come here for themselves and no to accommodate a few who are wealthy and want to rule our county. I have lived in Douglas county most of the time for 30 years and have never heard of one who has objected to the institution yet. Our Wilbur citizens are all glad to have it because we all believe in betterment in this line and will feel assured of good, reasonable treatment at a fair and square price. Above all the people of this county should be all means help to build up, instead of knocking.

Former German Empress Invalid

DOORN, Holland, July 10.—The former German Empress, Augusta Victoria, has undergone so much distress during the past two years that she has suffered for several months from aggravated attacks of heart disease. Recently she has been leading the life of an invalid. She has had milder attacks of this malady for many years.

At the House of Doorn, where surrounded by a staff of her own Berlin servants, and attended almost constantly by Countess Kellar—for many years her lady in waiting—she has recently been so completely indisposed that she has at times been unable to walk and has not for a long time been permitted to walk up or down the stairs. A special elevator was built for her use.

Those familiar with the inner life of the former Emperor's household since the flight from Potsdam to Holland declare that while William, consoling himself with religion, has been more or less of a stoic, the former Empress has suffered great mental distress and has felt severely the separation from her children.

From the time she arrived at Amerongen, in November, 1918, she has suffered continually. Now and then, she was the victim of heart attacks so severe that she was confined to her bed for several days at a time.

In the spring of 1920, when the Kapp revolution in Berlin was followed by an urgent demand that the former Emperor be closely guarded, the life of the exiles became more constrained and made Augusta's ailment more pronounced.
