FOURTH-CLASS POST- MASTER EXAMINATION.

The United States Civil Service
 Commission has announced an ex-
 amination to be held at Roseburg,
 Oregon, as a result of which it is
 expected to make certification to fill
 a contemplated vacancy in the position
 of fourth-class postmaster at
 Canyonville and other vacancies as
 they may occur at that office, unless
 it shall be decided in the interests
 of the service to fill any office by re-
 instatement. The compensation of the
 postmaster at this office was \$480
 for the last fiscal year.

Applicants must have reached their
 twenty-first birthday on the date of
 the examination, with the exception
 that in a state where women are
 declared by statute to be at full age
 for all purposes at eighteen years,
 women eighteen years of age on the
 date of the examination will be ad-
 mitted.

Applicants must reside within the
 territory supplied by the post office
 for which the examination is an-
 nounced.

The examination is open to all
 citizens of the United States who
 can comply with the requirements.
 Application blanks, Form 1753,
 and full information concerning the
 requirements of the examination can
 be secured from the postmaster at
 the place of vacancy, or from the
 United States Civil Service Commis-
 sion, Washington, D. C.

Applications should be properly
 executed and filed with the Com-
 mission at Washington, D. C., at the
 earliest practical date.
