Big Saving in Heating Power.

With a first cost for heating plant of about \$5,000, the Husqvarna factories in Sweden have been making an annual saving of 400 tons of coke for several years by utilizing surplus power. A hydraulic station supplied electric power, and as water-storage facilities are lacking, the electric generator continues to run at night, the current produced being turned into arc current for heating the 44,000 gallons of water in a large subterranean tank. During the daytime the hot water is circulated through the heating plant.
