The loss will total \$2,500, on which there is an insurance of \$500. Mr. Leatherwood recently purchased the prune orchard and drier from A. E. Shiria, of Sutherlin.

Want Farmers Put Names at Farms

Letters are being prepared by the secretary of the Chamber of Commerce directed to the granges asking the organizations if possible to secure the co-operation of their members in influencing all residents of the rural districts to place a small signboard at each farm in order to serve as a guide to motorists. At the present time there is no way of giving directions to those desiring to locate a certain farm or person. For instance, a friend of Farmer Jones may arrive from Portland. He knows approximately where Farmer Jones lives and inquires for a more explicit direction. What he receives is a sort of "follow your nose" proposition, for although nearly everyone knows Farmer Jones and the location of his farm, yet the matter of directing the stranger to that place is a difficult proposition.

If it were possible to tell the tourist to take a certain lane till he came to a road at the end of Farmer Brown's farm and then turn to the right until he reached Farmer Jones place, and the tourist found both of these farms by a neat white signboard bearing the name of the owner of the farm a great deal of time, trouble and misunderstanding would be saved. In other counties the farms are being marked by small signs, approximately 6 x 18 inches in size. They are painted white with the letters in black bearing the initials and last name of the owner of the farm. This aids a great deal in many ways and is particularly an aid to doctors, and persons making deliveries or having business on the farm with the owner. An active campaign to obtain the co-operation of the farmers in this matter will be conducted by the Chamber of Commerce and it is believed that good will result.
