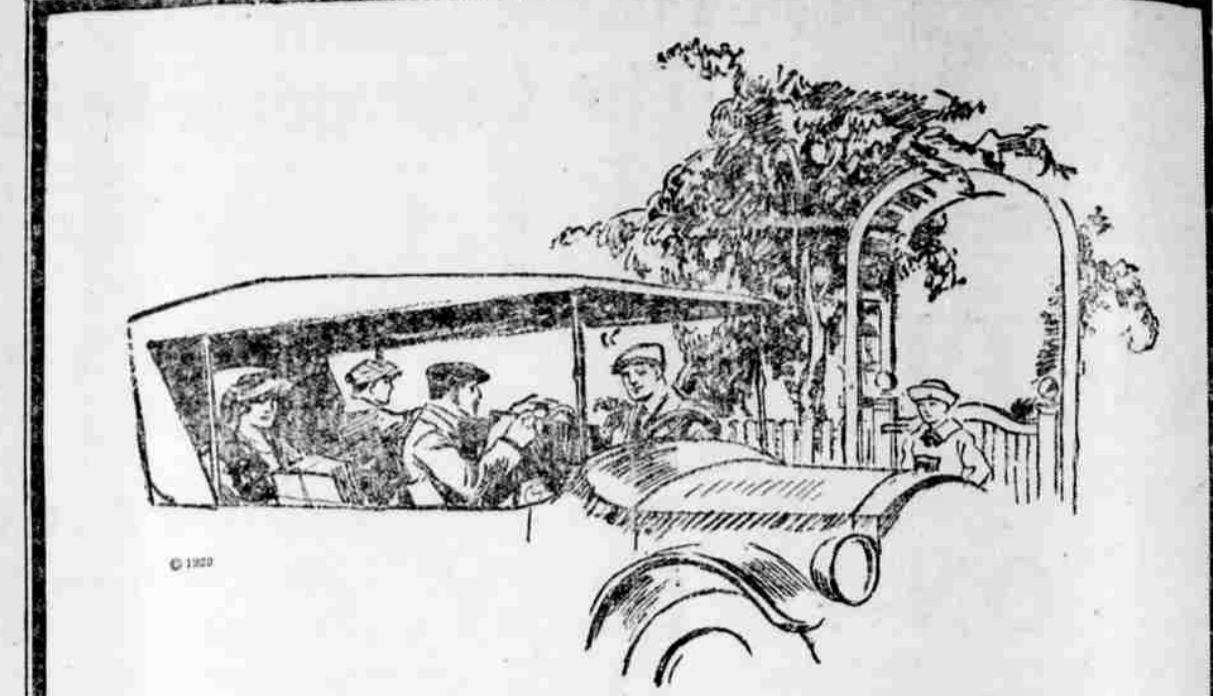
**HER
