SALESMAN IS IN PICTURE

"Now is the time to put that anthracnose spray on your fruit trees," says county agent H. E. Haslett. "Use Bordeaux 6-6-50 and be sure you get the bark surface well covered. On places showing bark injury be especially sure to hit every part of the wound."

"It is not too late to put in a cover crop. The crop will save more than 50 percent of the plant food that is available in the soil that would otherwise be lost through leaching. Further a legume crop will gather nitrogen from the air and when it is plowed under in the spring will help to start your trees growing and make you a better setting of fruit."

Further information can be obtained from the county agent or the fruit inspector.
