FOURTH CLASS POSTMASTER EXAMINATION.

The United States Civil Service Commission has announced an examination to be held at Roseburg, Ore., on Nov. 13, 1929, as a result of which it is expected to make certification to fill a contemplated vacancy in the position of fourth class postmaster at Canyonville, Ore., and other vacancies as they may occur at that office, unless it shall be decided in the interests of the service to fill any vacancy by reinstatement. The compensation of the postmaster at this office was \$480 for the last fiscal year.

Applicants must have reached their twenty-first birthday on the date of the examination, with the exception that in a state where women are declared by statute to be of age for all purposes at eighteen years women eighteen years of age on the date of the examination will be admitted.

Applicants must reside within the territory supplied by the postoffice for which the examination is announced.

The examination is open to all citizens of the United States who can comply with the requirements.

Application blanks, form 1752, and full information concerning the requirements of the examination can be secured from the postmaster at the place of vacancy or from the United States Civil Service Commission, Washington, D. C.

Applications should be properly executed and filed with the Commission at Washington, D. C., at the earliest practical date.

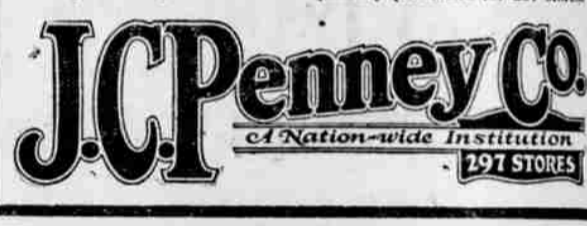

X-RAY FINGER PRINTS

PARIS, France, Oct. 8.—An improved method of taking criminals' fingerprints by X-rays has been invented by Dr. Henry Beclere. The process consists of rubbing the ends of the fingers with red lead, which is opaque to X-rays. On being X-ray photographed a photograph of the finger tip is obtained, similar to an inked print, but is much more accurate.
