CLEVELAND VICTORS 5TH GAME SUNDAY

Most Sensational, Unique and Thrilling Contest Ever Been Staged.

TRIPLE PLAY UNCANNY

Two Home Runs Clouted Out, First One With Three on Bases—Fans Go "Hog Wild" When Triple Play is Staged.

CLEVELAND, O., Oct. 11.—In a baseball game erupting sensational, unique and thrilling plays far beyond the wildest dreams of an imaginative fiction or scenario writer, the Cleveland Americans defeated the Brooklyn Nationals, 8 to 1, in the fifth contest of the world's series here yesterday afternoon.

A home run with the bases full is also an innovation in the modern history of the super-series, yet both these records were made yesterday, with a second home run, four double plays and a score of other fielding and batting features which would have been acclaimed as thrilling during the course of a normal world's series contest.

Triple Play Uncanny. There was something uncannily local about Wambegans' triple play. The Indians' second baseman was born in Cleveland in 1894 and after learning the fundamentals of the national game at Concordia college, entered the professional baseball ranks.

That a native-born ball player of Cleveland should have made such an unusual play is a coincidence, but that a previous similar play should have been made in the same park 11 years ago savors of something beyond coincidence. But 11 times in the records of the American pastime has an unassisted triple play been accomplished.

Prune Water Ice Said to be Good

Several prune recipes that are well worth trying have been received at the Hotel Umpqua within the past few days, among them being one for prune water ice, the first of its kind that has yet been printed.

Prune Conserve—5 pounds sugar, 5 pounds prunes, 3 oranges, 2 lemons, 1 package raisins, 25c nuts. Cut the prunes in small pieces, at the sugar over them and leave stand all night.

Prune Water Ice—Prune preparation—Put 1 1/2 pounds of prunes in a stew pan, adding a little water, cover the pan and set on the back of the range, simmering slowly until tender; rub through colander, sweeten to taste, then freeze same as ice cream.

Water Ice—One pint clarified sugar, one half pint water, grate 2 lemons on sugar, juice of five lemons and two oranges, add together and strain through hair sieve; when cold serve as ice cream.

Prune Cake, two layers—1 cup of sugar, 1-3 cup butter, 3 eggs, using the whites of two for frosting.

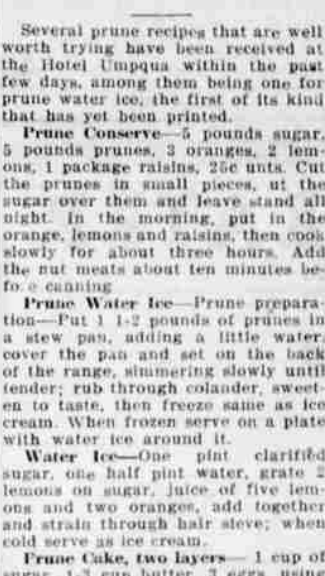

Brown to Don Toga Tuesday Morning

SALEM, Ore., Oct. 10.—Attorney General George M. Brown will take his place upon the bench of the Oregon Supreme Court Tuesday morning if he finds it practicable to close up the affairs of attorney-general in time. When he takes his oath as a member of the court he will automatically cease to be attorney-general, and the latter office will immediately be filled by J. H. Van Winkle, first assistant attorney-general, who was appointed by governor Olcott to succeed Mr. Brown.

As the supreme court has much work before it members have indicated to Mr. Brown their desire that he take up his new duties as soon as possible, while on the other hand, the attorney general has felt that he must dispose of various matters which are pending before his department before he steps out of the office he has held the last six years.

When Mr. Brown dons the official robes, he says he will be ready to take hold of the work of the supreme court with the same energy he put into his work as attorney general.

One feature of his appointment, which is particularly pleasing to Mr. Brown and his friends is the exceedingly cordial reception his appointment received at the hands of the other members of the court.
