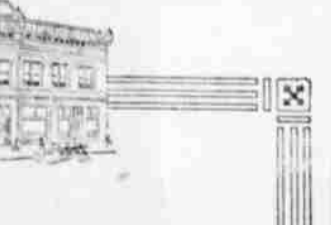
High School Debate Question Stated
