### Former Resident Dies at Stayton

Mrs. Sarah Frances Archambeau, whose maiden name was Cummings, who passed away at the family home near Stayton, Oregon, October 15, 1929, was born in California Feb. 7, 1829, being 61 years 8 months and 8 days old at the time of her death.

She came to Oregon June 1876 with her mother, four sisters and brother, and settled near Roseburg, Douglas County. She was married to L. M. Archambeau, July 13, 1878, and lived on a farm in Flournoy Valley, Douglas County, until the year 1891, when she moved to the present home near Stayton, Oregon.

Two other children, Francis Burden and Lewis Edward passed away while quite young, while living in Douglas County.

She is survived by her husband, and one son, Elmer, at home and one daughter, Mrs. Charles Leffler, and two grandchildren, Gladys and Raymond Leffler; also three sisters and one brother: W. K. Mann of Portland, Oregon; Mrs. Mary Elliott, of Cottage Grove, Oregon, and Mrs. Wm. Anderson of Portland, Oregon.

She leaves a large circle of friends and relatives, both in Lin and Douglas counties, and in other parts of the state, who mourn her loss, as her friends were only limited to the extent of her acquaintance.

The funeral was held from the Baptist Church in Stayton, Oregon, C. B. Rees, pastor of the Stayton Methodist Episcopal Church, officiating. Interment was in the Masonic cemetery at Stayton, Oregon.

Will Rogers new Goldwyn picture "Almost a Husband," which comes to the Antlers tonight in the picture of the novel "Old Ebenezer" by Opie Read. It is the sympathetic story of the rise of a bashful country school teacher to the position of respect and affection in the little village of Old Ebenezer.
