### County Clerk.

Why should a county official be punished for efficiency? The one and only argument advanced against the re-election of Ed Lenox as county clerk is that he has held the office a long time. Just why has Lenox been re-elected from time to time in the face of an overwhelming registered majority? It is because he has proven himself to be an exceptionally well qualified and efficient county clerk. Would not this same argument of voting a person out of office because he has held it a long time, lead to an illogical and ridiculous conclusion if applied to other matters, as for instance, school teacher, the supreme court judge, or indeed, the good wife?

P. Coshov to the voters of Lane county as an excellent choice among the several candidates who are expected to ask for endorsement at the polls."

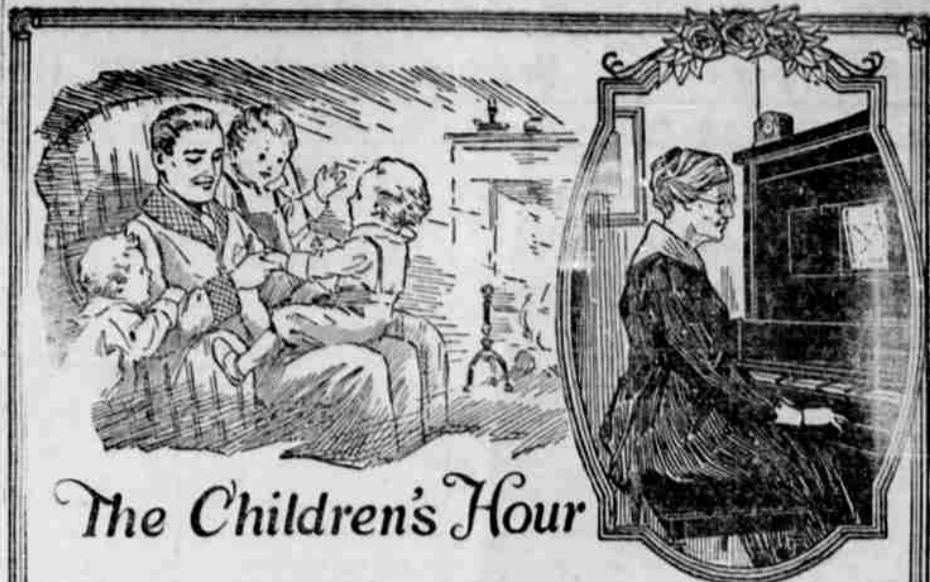

## Oregon Must Have a Port Equal to Any Port on the Pacific Coast.

Initiative measure No. 310 on the ballot gives to the Port of Portland means to create such a port.  
The primary object of this bill is to furnish the means to insure the opening and maintaining of a 20-foot channel from Portland to the sea and of building and establishing port facilities at the City of Portland sufficient to handle the foreign and coastwise shipping of that port.  
The cost of this improvement will be met by the people living within the boundaries of the Port of Portland.  
When you go to the Polls Nov. 2nd second vote 310 YES and give to the Port of Portland the power to maintain its 20-foot channel to the sea and to build adequate port facilities to handle all of the great products of the interior of the state.  
The passage of this bill means lower freight rates for the products of Oregon in reaching the markets of the world and a consequent greater profit to the producers.  
This is the most important and the most valuable measure that has ever been put up to the voters of the interior portions of the state.

The democratic county committee is asking support of its local candidates not so much on the ground of party affiliation, but by reason of the fitness and superior qualifications of the candidates who happen to be registered as democrats.

The great national issue before the people of the nation this year, is, of course, the League of Nations. The national election is a great referendum on that question, but the election of county officials has no bearing whatever on the League of Nations. The citizens of Douglas county should get away from party affiliation in the election of their county officials. In each office to be filled the candidate should be elected, who is most capable of filling the office creditably and efficiently. The democratic committee is therefore, asking the support of the voters of Douglas county for the democratic county candidates because, taken man for man, the democratic list offers in this particular county election, a more efficient and better qualified list of candidates than the opposing party. The democratic committee will be satisfied if the voters of the county will vote in each instance for the best qualified man.

**State Senator**  
In advocating the election of J. E. McClintock as state senator, the committee feels sure of its position. Mr. McClintock is the ideal type of man that makes an efficient legislator. Nearly all legislation of today is decided in committee rooms, and the legislator who really accomplishes something for his locality is not necessarily the man who can talk the loudest or show the greatest heat in discussion, but the man who tolerates and respects the views of others, and who can sit around a committee table and both give and take.

In the nine years McClintock has lived in Roseburg, he has made a host of friends, by reason of his sterling character, and those attributes by which a friendly man draws friends to himself. He would win friends and respect in the state senate. That's his disposition; and he would accomplish results. He would devote his time and attention to matters that are really worth while. He would not like to indulge in bitter denunciation and intolerance of those who might differ with him. He is well informed, an easy speaker, or thoroughly conversant with the needs and interests of Douglas county. He has no whims, he rides no hobby. In matters of law he is well informed, though not of the legalistic mind that sometimes proves a bane.

The call for McClintock's candidacy came not alone from members of his own political party, but from influential men of the opposition party as well, who felt a strong desire to have Douglas county represented in the state senate, by some good level headed likable man.

Mr. McClintock took an active part in all war activities and furnished two sons for overseas.  
It is generally conceded that McClintock will carry the city of Roseburg by a comfortable majority. It argues well for a man when he is supported by his home people—those who know him best. He is entitled to win in the county as well.

### County Commissioner.

In casting about for a man to represent them on the county board, the people seek first a man who is absolutely honest and second, a man who has made a success of his own business, for such a man can be trusted to successfully handle the county business. In R. W. Long, candidate for county commissioner, reared in Douglas county, he knows and understands existing conditions and the wants of its people. By industry, honesty, and progressiveness he has made a success of his own business. His farm is a model for progressive farmers. He knows what good roads mean to a farmer, and, if elected, will see to it that good market roads are built. He stands for progress, but demands full measure for every dollar of the people's money expended. Honest, capable and successful, that is Bob Long.

### Sheriff.

There must be a great many good qualities in any man with as many friends as Harry Pearce. These friends are not limited to the democratic party, with which Harry is identified, but many of his most active supporters are republicans.  
Harry Pearce is well qualified for the office of Sheriff. He is fearless, has an ample store of the initiative, and a good fund of common horse sense. He would devote his attention to the real criminals and would uphold the reputation that Douglas county has won under Sheriff Quine. He would enforce the law without fear, favor or bias, and would give an efficient administration of the office.  
Personally, Harry is a likeable sort of a man, open, frank, and with a heart as big as an ox. Anyone in need or distress never called on Harry Pearce in vain.
