In this era of intensive road construction there is no county office of more importance to the taxpayers of Douglas County than that of the County Surveyor. Hundreds of thousands of dollars of tax money will be expended in road work in Douglas County within the next year or two. As a matter of economy, it behooves the tax payers of the county to secure the services of the very best engineer obtainable to supervise the road construction. It is not only a matter of knowing what to do, but it is more a matter of knowing what not to do. Millions of dollars have been wasted in road building, because of lack of knowledge of what not to do.

In advocating the election of William K. Wright as county surveyor, the committee offers a skilled engineer who knows not only what to do, but as well knows what not to do. His 15 years of experience in road engineering equips him with a practical knowledge in road building that cannot be gained by observation or study, and that is not often possessed by a county surveyor. Wright is a practical man. He must be a capable and efficient engineer, or else he would not have held the position of resident engineer with the state highway commission. He has taken up his home in Roseburg, and his residence here gives the county a rare opportunity to secure the services of an exceptionally capable man. His election would be a matter of saving many thousand dollars to Douglas County.

Capt. Wright secured his technical training at the University of Montana. When America entered the war he volunteered his services, and went overseas as a private in the 15th engineers, one of the first outfits to arrive in France to build the roads and railroads from French ports to the front, to make it possible to get men and supplies up to the firing line. Private Wright won his spurs in the field, and returned from the fields of France a Captain. His promotion came in recognition of his ability and bravery.

Douglas County would overlook an opportunity not to secure Capt. Wright's services as county surveyor. His election would mean an unusually capable and efficient man in charge of road building in this county.

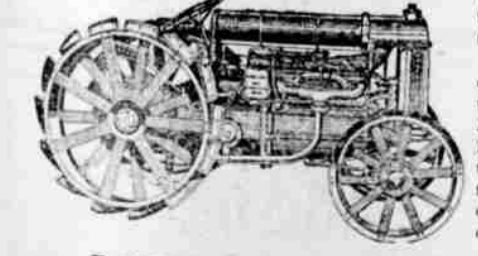
