LARGE SUM MONEY SPENT IN RUSSIA

Fourteen Million Dollars Expended For Relief of Suffering.

ESTHONIANS GIVEN AID

Service Was Extended to Millions of Men, Women and Children-- Work Carried on by Commissions from U. S.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 2.—Fourteen million dollars, covering the costs of distribution of articles ranging from auto-ambulances to safety pins, have been expended by the American Red Cross in its relief work in Russia.

At one time the dead were piled in the corners of the rooms with the sick and no effort at decent burial was made. In a hospital at Revel, consisting of a single barrack with 140 beds in one room, there were 600 deaths in one week.
