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Boy Scouts Exhibit Work

A Boy Scout exhibition has been arranged in the window of the Parlow and Bell second hand store and has caused much comment among pedestrians today. Farm Bureau Meetings Being Held

Farm bureau meetings to consider the federation of the county organizations into a state body are being held this week in eight Oregon counties. The aims, purposes and methods of affiliation are being explained at all the county meets by Paul V. Maris, extension director of the agricultural college and state leader of county agent work; Chester H. Gray, member of the executive committee American Farm Bureau federation, and George A. Mansfield, president of the temporary state federation.

The desirability of the state federation, when made permanent, affiliating with the American farm bureau federation is also a leading subject of consideration at the county meets. The temporary state organization will become the permanent organization as soon as the constitution has been ratified by 12 county bureaus.

Forty-eight carloads of apples have been sent out from Roseburg by the Oregon Growers, according to Manager Mahan of the local plant. A large number of cars have also been sent out from Sutherlin and Riddle, while 16 will leave Roseburg this

next week. The last of the Newtown run is now on and within a couple of weeks practically all apples will have been shipped from the county. The number of cars shipped this year will probably not be as great as last season, but will still be up to the normal mark.
