PILGRIMS' DAY.

The nation will gladly heed the president's proclamation requesting the general observance of December 21 as Pilgrims' Day. The date marks the 360th anniversary of the landing of the Pilgrim Fathers on the "stern and rock-bound coast" of New England. It is to be observed with special ceremonies in the English communities from which the Pilgrims came and in those localities in New England most intimately associated with their history in this country. Their coming meant as much to the rest of the country, however, and they are rightfully honored throughout the land.

History portrays those early fathers as a group stern and intolerant, in spite of the fact that they fled to the new world to escape intolerance. Yet if we read their own accounts of their struggles to preserve freedom and to wrest a living from the wilderness to which they had come, we learn that they were as human as ourselves, that they suffered and endured much for the sake of the principles they revered, and that they had courage and faith and loyalty.

Their wilderness widened out into a fruitful and pleasant land. Subsequent generations have not had to fight the same obstacles nor fear the same perils which confronted the Pilgrim settlers. But the ideals and principles which guided and upheld them through their difficult days are still worthy of holding and will still guide and uphold the nation, if it remembers them faithfully.

THE OLD RAIL FENCE.

Oh the old rail fence where the older bushes grew and the ruby lips of roses caught the kisses of the dew, with its little cozy corners where we played in other days when the south wind came a-whispering across the sheltered ways and the tinkling cowbells echoed with a soft and lulling strain from the dreamy woodland pasture down the cool and shady lane. Oh the old rail fence that we loved in days gone by when the world was full of music and there wasn't any sigh, when each road led straight to heaven and each lip with laughter smiled and the sunshine lay in wind-

We have left the good old place, we have wandered to and fro, we have lost the dew and laughter of the days of long ago, we are wiser to the world, we have played the weary game, we have chased the empty haunts, we have compassed wealth and fame; but how oft we look with longing through the shadows dim and dense for the dreams we dreamed in childhood by the old rail fence.—Clem Bradshaw.

Yanks Against Ruthless Murder

WARSAW, Nov. 18.—American fliers composing the Kosviusko squadron of the Polish army have had many opportunities to bomb the train of six cars which General Budenny, the bolshevik cavalry leader, used as headquarters at the front; but they always refused to do so because they know his wife and baby lived on board the train. On several occasions when the Budenny special was located by the Americans they knew pretty well that the cavalry commander was at his traveling home for a visit with his wife and youngster, but they always let pass the chance to do him or his train damage.

It was reported some time ago that Budenny had been wounded by a bomb dropped by one of the American fliers while he was engaged in one of his spectacular raids on the southern Polish front before the armistice was declared.

It was also said that he had taken up arms against the reds and that he might join forces with General Wrangel.

General Budenny is a Kuban cosack and was a sergeant-major in the old imperial Russian army. He has been seen many times from the air by the Americans and is described as a short, stocky man with quite an intelligent countenance despite the wild, outdoor life he has led for years.

His dress was picturesque, consisting most of the time of a black Cosack hat, khaki tunic, black trousers with bright blue stripes and high black boots. He is an excellent horseman and often led his troops into battle against the Poles.
