SAN FRANCISCO, Cal., Dec. 1.—Sharp declines in the prices of sugar during the passage of a cargo originally valued at \$567,000 from Java to San Francisco resulted in a suit over the shipment here today.

A temporary restraining injunction was issued to the Continental Candy company restraining two banks and a refining company from drawing on letters of credit to the amount of the original value of the shipment.

The sugar was sold at \$19.85 a cental, and is now worth about \$7.
