Auto Owners Must Get Their Licenses

Motor vehicle owners who have not applied for their 1921 license are urged by the secretary of state to do so at once in order to avoid congestion in the department around the first of the coming year and also that they may avoid arrest by the peace officers for failure to carry 1921 license plates after January 1, 1921. The law will be rigidly enforced by the inspectors of the department. There are now over 165,000 licensed cars in Oregon. To this time about 9,000 applications for the 1921 license have been received. The facilities of the department are limited and unless the work involved in issuing licenses is distributed over a reasonable period car owners cannot expect to receive their license plates promptly. By delay they are improving their chance for arrest for failure to have their 1921

license by January 1, 1921, about October first blanks were forwarded to all the owners of motor vehicles for applying for 1921 licenses. If any of them failed to receive blanks it has been by reason of change of residence not reported to the office or failure of the mails. Application blanks may be secured of your chief of police or marshal, city or town recorder, sheriff, county clerk and the licensed vehicle dealers in your locality, or by request to the secretary of state, Salem, Oregon.

The purchase price, with an additional sum of one-fifth of one per cent thereof, being commission allowed, must be deposited at once in money to be returned if sale is not approved, otherwise patent will issue for the timber which must be removed within ten years. Bids will be received from citizens of the United States, associations of such citizens and corporations organized under the laws of the United States or any state, territory or district thereof only. Upon application of a qualified purchaser, the timber on any land subdivision will be offered separately before being included in any offer of a larger unit.
