every day. It is going to be difficult to take care of these requests for assistance when illness or any calamity visits the county. There are hundreds of people in Roseburg who have not paid their dollar to the local Red Cross solicitors and you have not been called upon, Mr. B. W. Sjöberg, president of the Umpqua Valley Bank, will be glad to receive your subscription, and give you a receipt for your dollar.

Douglas County has never yet fallen down upon any worth while movement and unless your membership is continued in the Red Cross, you may be called upon during the winter to assist worthy cases of distress in your neighborhood.

It is not the purpose or intention of the Red Cross to take over the work of any church, lodge or organization as each of these bodies have their own methods for rendering assistance and caring for those in distress reported to them. The Douglas County Chapter of the A. R. C. will be glad to cooperate and render what assistance its Chapter permits when cases are brought to any of the members of the Board of Directors.

\$2,500.00 should be the minimum amount raised in Douglas county to care for the local needs of this Chapter as 50 per cent of this money remains permanently in Roseburg to be used as outlined above. Do not let Christmas find you without a Red Cross button signifying that you are not willing to contribute towards the relief and distress of those less fortunate than yourself.

If any of the solicitors previously reported, have not completed their territory, Mr. Strong asks that they realize the necessity for giving a little time to this work and making complete returns to him as soon as possible in order that the county may know as quickly as possible what amounts may be apportioned for Red Cross work.

OVER 2000 LET OUT.

SAN FRANCISCO, Dec. 7.—It was estimated at the offices of the Southern Pacific that in the mechanical department of the Pacific division to date approximately 2000 men have been laid off.

It was explained that this "was merely a return to normal," the mechanical force during the period of

war control having jumped from 15,000 to 19,000. It was estimated that about 17,000 men are still employed.
